Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors approve the appointment of the Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Services Department Director to the Executive Committee of the Community Corrections Partnership.

Summary Text:

The California Community Corrections Performance Incentive Act of 2009 (Senate Bill 678) created the fourteen member Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) established in Penal Code (PC) Section §1230 to advise the Chief Probation Officer regarding the application of Evidence Based Probation practices. Assembly Bills 109 and 117 expand the role of the CCP and created an Executive Committee of the Community Corrections Partnership (ECCCP) comprised of the Chief Probation Officer as Chair, a Chief of Police, the Sheriff, the District Attorney, the Public Defender, the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court or designee, and a member from either County Department of Social Services, Mental Health, or Alcohol and Substance Abuse Programs, as appointed by the Board.

Both the Director of Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health Services (ADMHS) and the Director of the Department of Social Services (DSS) are at large members of the CCP. However, based on the needs and risks of the realigned population subject to community supervision, ADMHS staff have been instrumental in the development of treatment and service strategies for the target population.

Background:

The CCP is required to develop an expenditure plan for the 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act and the ECCCP is the body designated to vote and approve the plan for submission to the Board of Supervisors. The plan and recommended programs are to be consistent with local needs and resources as applied to the realignment population. The Executive Committee will oversee and report on the progress of the implementation plan and will make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for local state realignment funds to be applied to the various components of the plan. The Board of Supervisors maintains full authority over the appropriation of local state realignment funds.

On August 2, 2011, your Board appointed Ann Detrick, Ph. D, Director of ADMHS to the ECCCP. Ann Detrick will separate from the county in January 2013 resulting in a vacancy on the ECCCP. Recognizing that Dr. Wada's oversight of ADMHS is temporary, County Counsel has suggested that the Director of ADMHS be named the member of the ECCCP rather than name Dr. Wada specifically. Appointment of the ADMHS Director to the ECCCP completes the designated membership defined in PC §1230.1.

State funding for 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act is based on formulas developed by the State Department of Finance in collaboration with California County Administrative Officers and the California State Association of Counties. Santa Barbara County's allocation for Fiscal Year (FY) 2012-13 is \$7,970,922. The FY 2012-13 plan was approved by your Board on May 22, 2012. The County's FY 2013-14 allocation is expected to be \$9,446,143. The Executive Committee will make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors for allocation of the FY 2013-14 State realignment funds to finance the various components of the plan.
