RESOLUTION TO HONOR CASEY CASE CONGRATULATING HIM ON HIS RETIREMENT FROM HANCOCK COLLEGE CALIFORNIA

WHEREAS: Casey was born and raised in Santa Maria at a time when the population was about 9,000 and life was a whole lot easier. Coming from a small town boy to a world traveler Casey has brought to his students at Hancock a broader arena and understanding, and:

WHEREAS: Casey started his professional career with college, earning a BA in psychology from Stanford University with a minor in anthropology. After college he decided to join the Peace Corp. This altered the shape of his life. Casey worked in the countryside of the Dominican Republic with small groups of farmers improving water supplies, and developing cooperatives. During his stay, the Revolution erupted which led to the subsequent invasion of U.S. troops. Casey said, "I was an isolated American among thousands of Dominicans and none understood why the U.S. had invaded their island."

WHEREAS: Casey returned to the states and went back to school, this time to earn his MFA in Motion picture production from UCLA. Upon this second graduation he began his career as a documentary filmmaker. He has been the sound recorder, director, producer, and Spanish interpreter. Locations have taken him to Washington D.C., to the Black and Puerto Rican Ghettos of Hartford, Connecticut and from Texas to rural Farmersville, California. The common thread running through the projects was "to bring different ethnic and sociological groups together to improve communications."


