Third Supervisorial District

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

 A. Approve the Isla Vista Continuous Deflective Separation (CDS) Project for removing pollutants from storm water runoff and to protect water quality and the attached CEQA Notice of Exemption (post); and

B. Authorize the Public Works Director to advertise and receive bids for the project.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendations are primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The Isla Vista CDS Project will consist of installing stormwater quality treatment facilities at three separate locations within Santa Barbara County. These CDS units will be installed in Isla Vista along Del Playa Drive at the following locations:

- Camino Pescadero
- Camino Del Sur
- Between Camino Del Sur and Camino Corto

If difficulties arise or delays occur in acquiring a temporary construction easement, the Camino Pescadero site may not be constructed simultaneously with the remaining two sites.

The project is an element of Project Clean Water, a multi-agency effort led by the County to address stormwater quality issues in the County. Installation of this project should begin late 2003 prior to the winter runoff period.

Mandates and Service Levels:

Water quality improvement efforts have been the goal of Project Clean Water. This project will also support the County's requirements under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II regulations of the Clean Water Act. This pilot project is a structural Best Management Practice that can be used in areas of new development or existing development. Information on installation, maintenance, and overall effectives will be used for potential future projects, and will help address County compliance with the storm water management plan required under the Phase II NPDES permit.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

This project is the continuation of a series of projects funded through the State of California. The majority of the funding for this project will be provided through a \$2.1 million grant agreement with the California Coastal Conservancy. A resolution agreeing to the terms and conditions of the grant agreements and authorizing the Public Works Director to enter into each agreement with the Coastal Conservancy to receive these funds was approved by your Board on November 14, 2000. Additional costs of the project will be covered by an \$80,000 grant from the Shoreline Preservation Fund, a student-funded program at the University of California, Santa Barbara.

To date, a number of water quality improvement projects have been installed. These include: a bioswale and CDS unit at the end of Turnpike Road, CDS units in Carpinteria and Isla Vista, a bioswale and two CDS units at Walnut Park Townhomes near Rhoads Ave. and Walnut Ave. Approximately \$1.1M of the \$2.1M grant has been spent in site selection, design, and construction of these projects.

This project was included in a final budget adjustment in the 2003-04 Adopted Budget in the Water Agency cost center of the Water Resources Division. The costs associated with this project will be paid from Dept: 054, Fund: 3060, Acct: 8200, Program: 3008. Long-term maintenance of the CDS units will be funded by Project Clean Water and will be included each year in the Water Agency cost center of the Water Resources Division budget.
