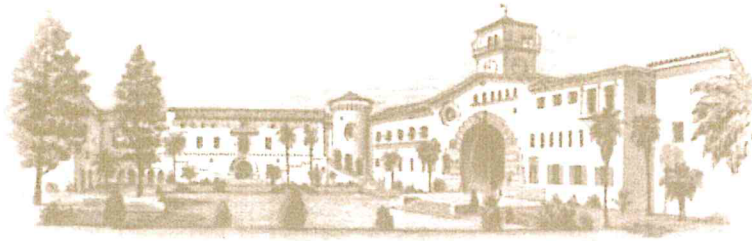

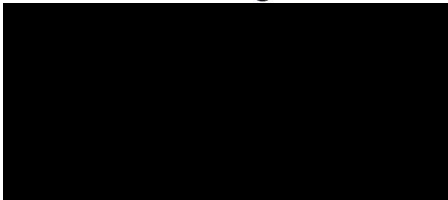



I am interested in serving on the Library Advisory Committee because I am a big supporter of public libraries. I have completed one year serving on the LAC, appointed to serve as a member for the 5th District. I would like to represent the 4th District as a LAC member. I have written and received several library grants for the Orcutt Library, started a Preschool Storytime 7 years ago and recruited a team of retired teachers to rotate reading days. The result has been an amazing increase in overall library circulation, numbers of visitors to the library, and a monthly increase due, in part, to the community outreach through this program to families. Years ago, when the Guadalupe Library was located in a small area, I joined their Friends group, lobbied with Lois Capps, met with a grant writer and celebrated their current location. I continue to support their efforts by maintaining my membership and donating to the Friends of Guadalupe Library.
