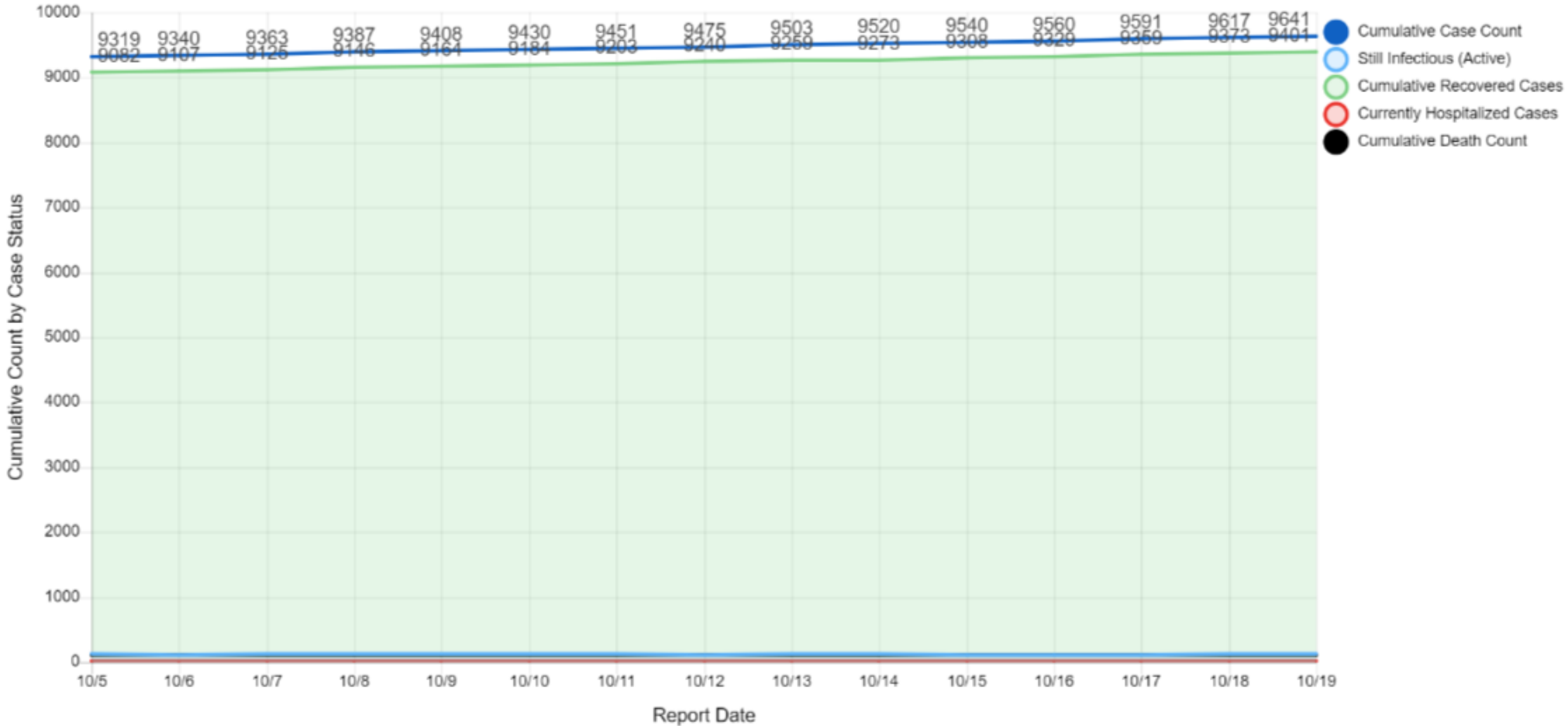

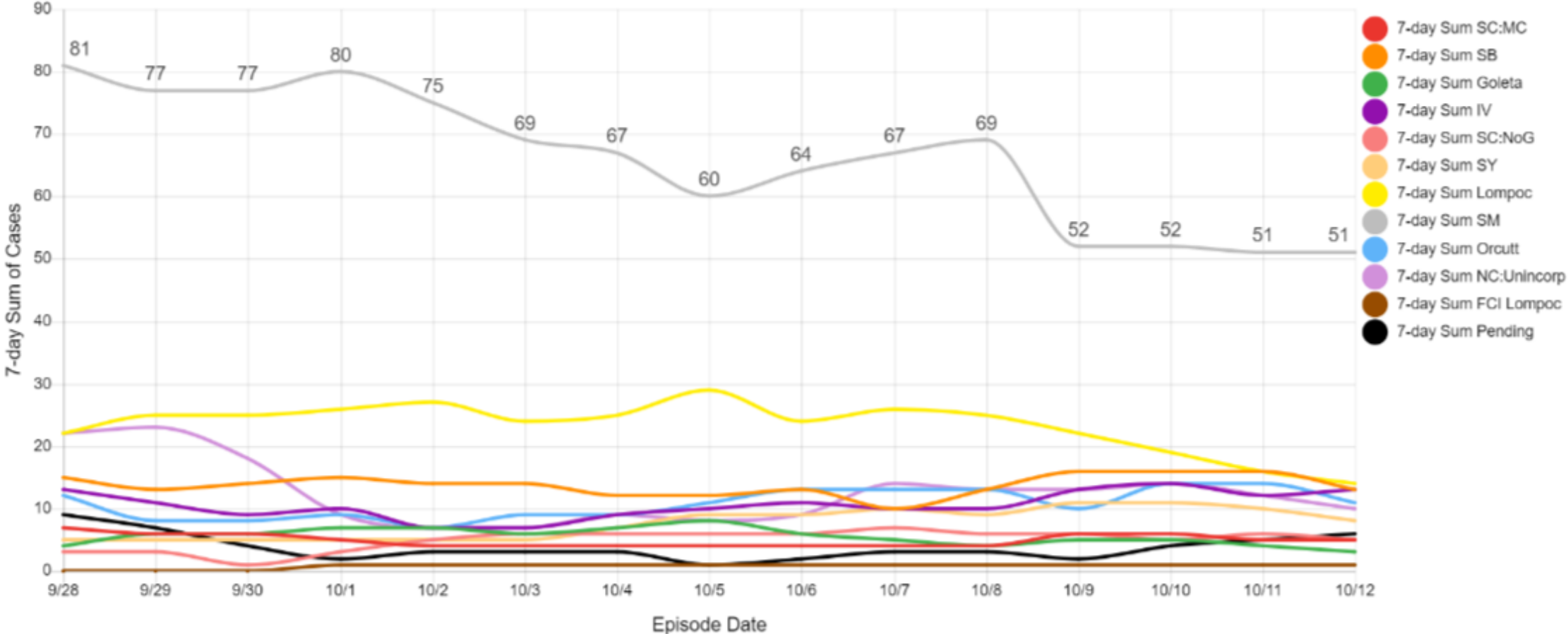
# Santa Barbara County COVID-19 By The Numbers

CUMULATIVE CASE STATUS REPORTED AS OF TODAY

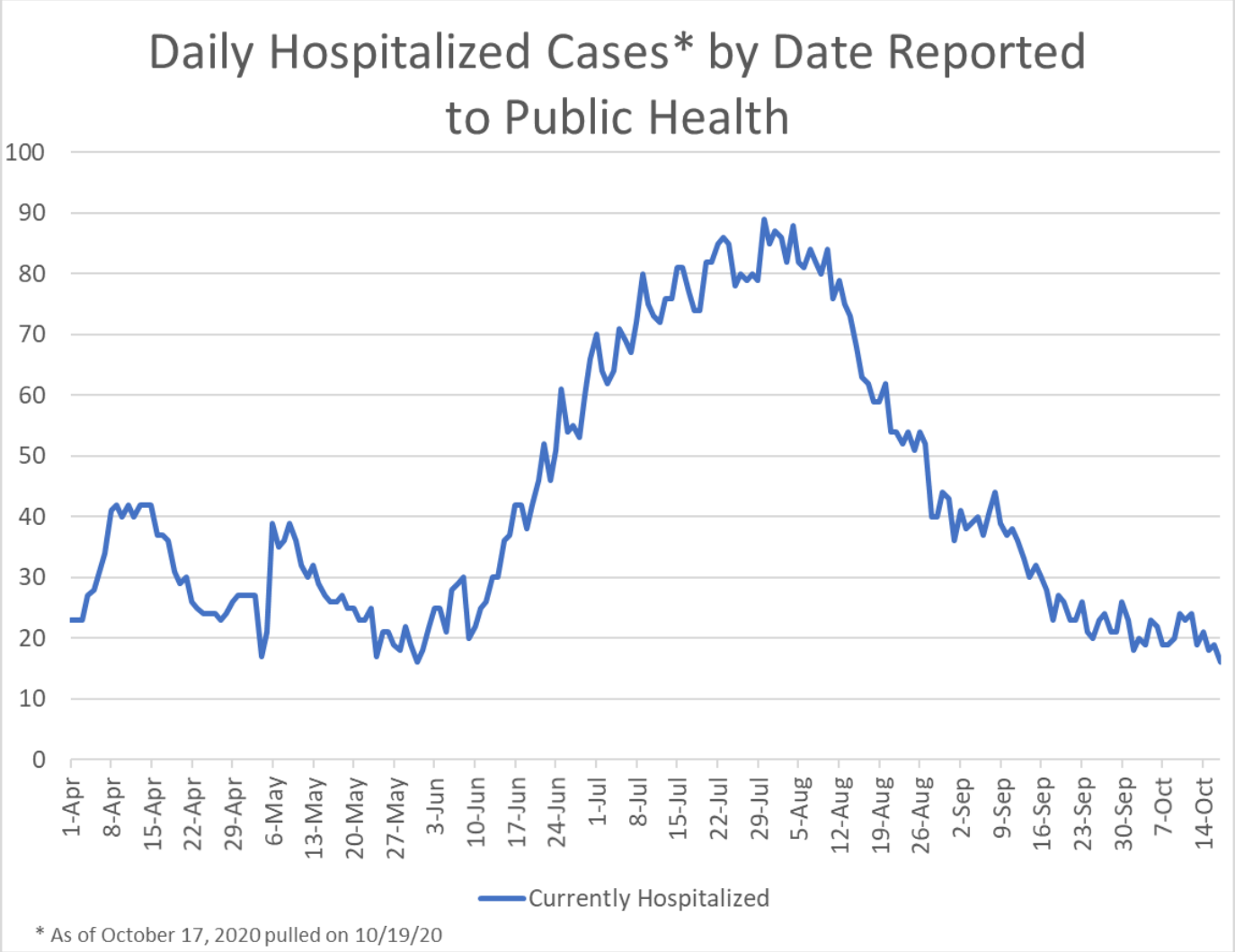

7-DAY ROLLING SUM OF NEW CASES BY AREA

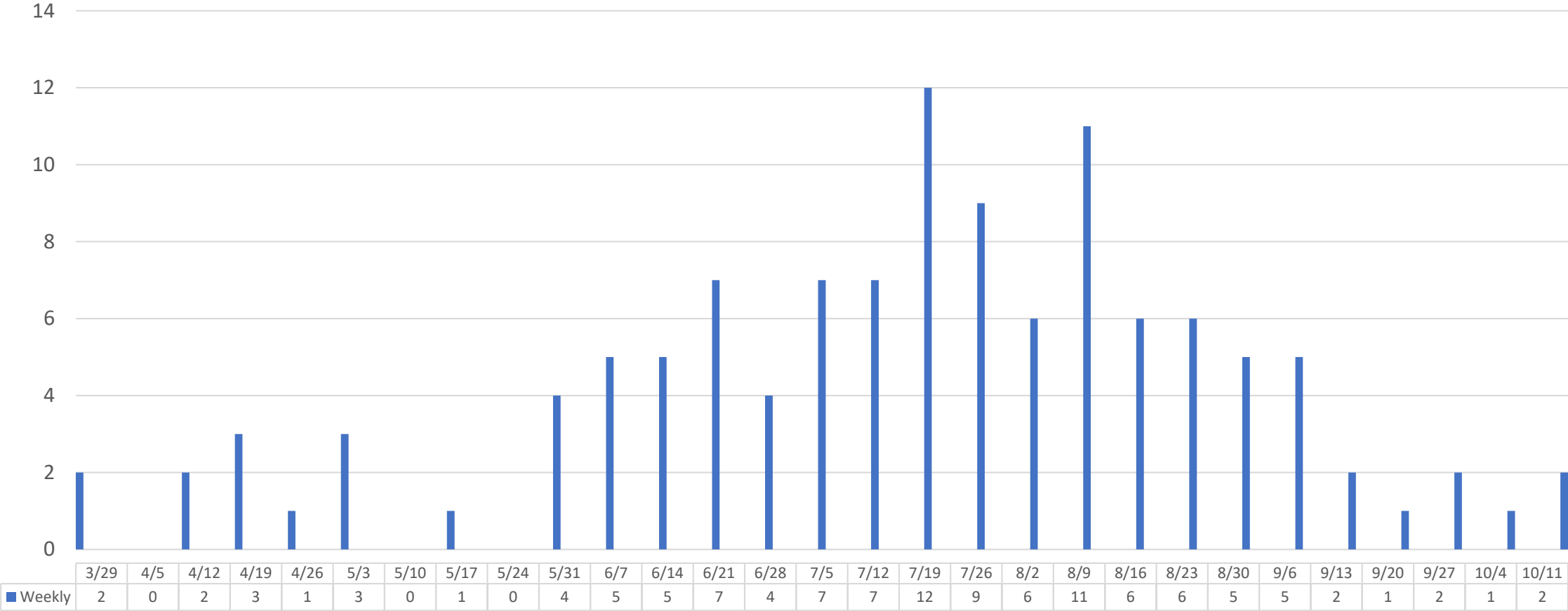

COVID-19 Deaths by Week of Death\*



7-day average of daily COVID-19 cases per 100K with 7-day lag, adjusted for number of tests performed

## Positivity rate\*\*

7-day average of all COVID-19 tests performed that are positive

<p><b>MODERATE</b></p> <p>Some indoor business operations are open with modifications</p>	<p><b>1 – 3.9</b></p> <p>Daily new cases (per 100k)</p>	<p><b>2 – 4.9% and 2.2 – 5.2% health equity metric</b></p> <p>Positive tests</p>

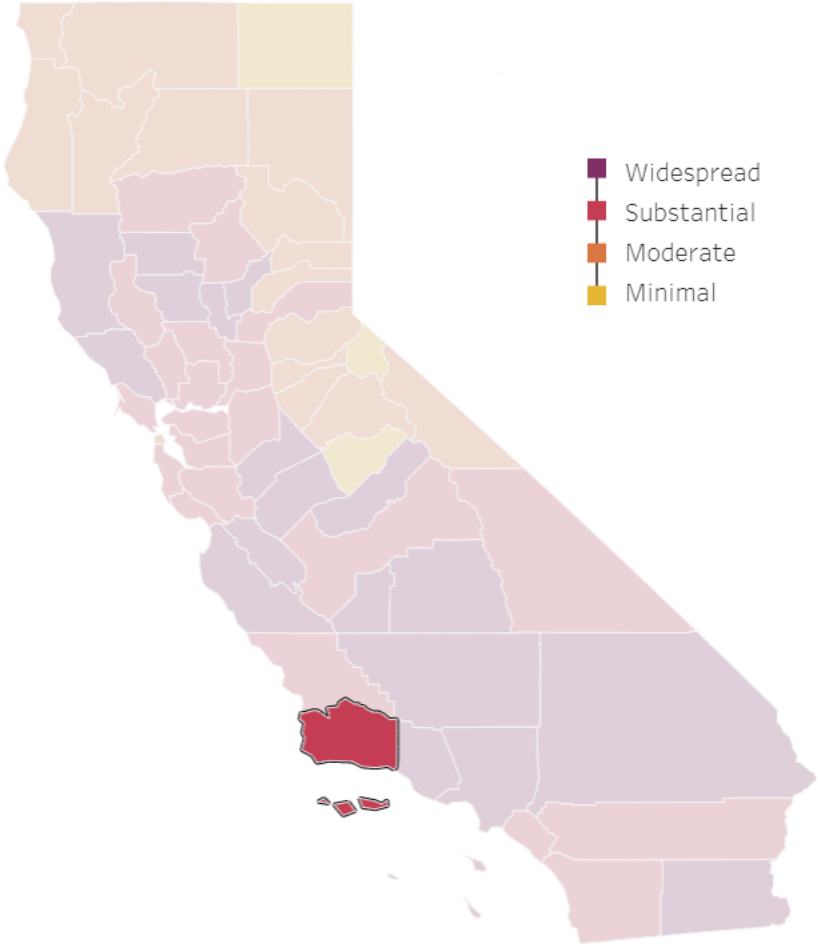

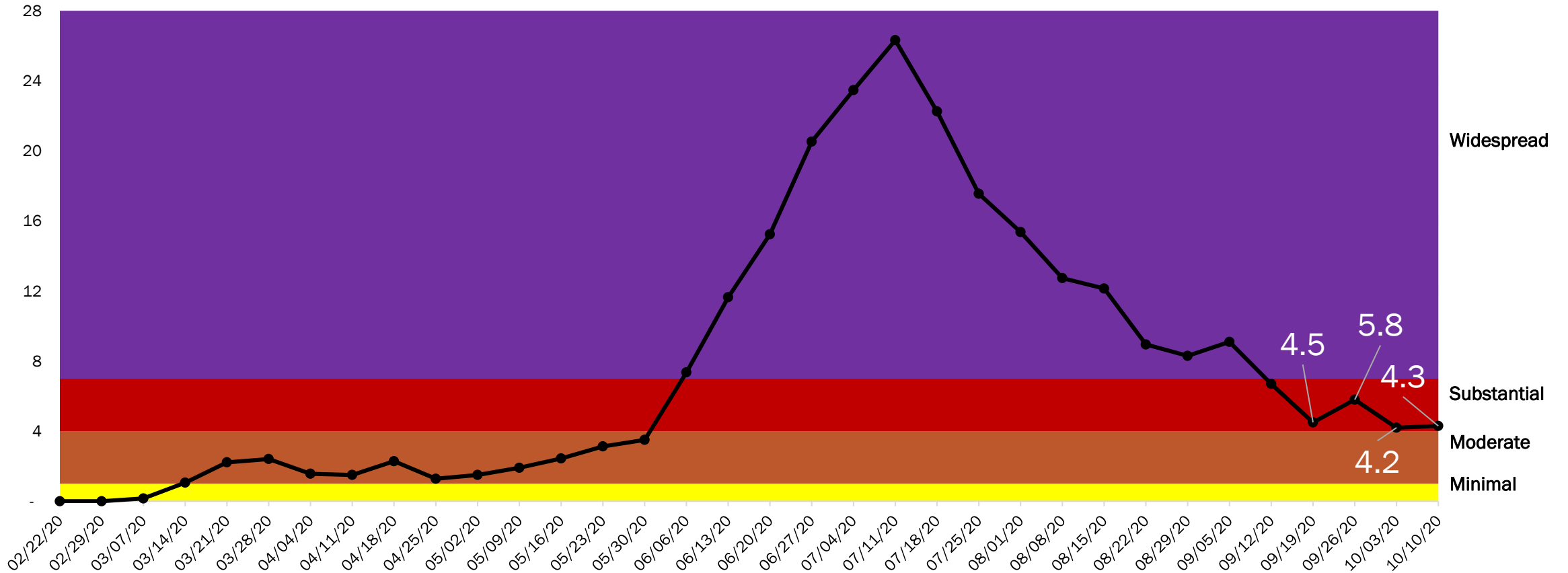

Santa Barbara County 7-day Average Adjusted\* Case Rate per 100,000 Community Residents



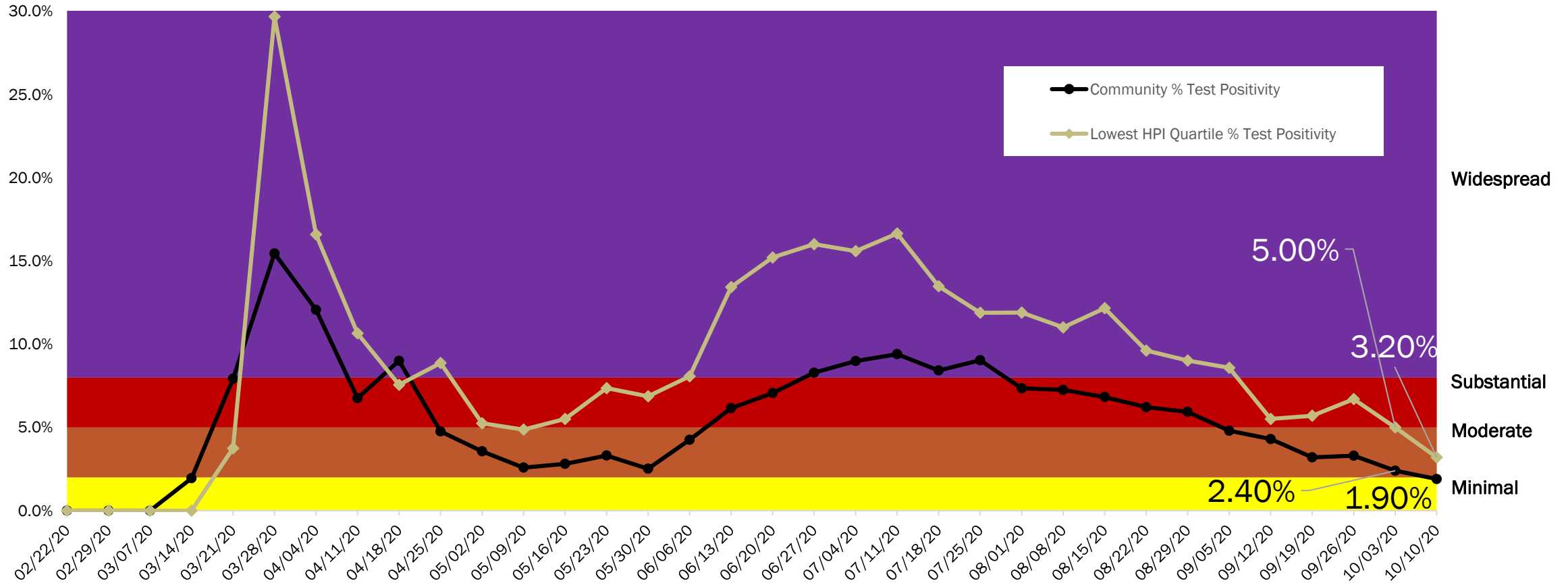
