# FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA AND CLEAN HARBORS ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC.

This AMENDMENT to the AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the:

COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, CALIFORNIA, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", and

CLEAN HARBORS ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR".

WHEREAS, COUNTY and CONTRACTOR have an existing AGREEMENT dated June 16, 2022 for the transportation, management, recycling and disposal of hazardous waste collected through County solid waste collection programs.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED as follows:

1. The **AGREEMENT** is amended to replace **4. TERM** as follows:

CONTRACTOR shall commence performance on July 1, 2022 and end performance upon completion but no later than June 30, 2027 unless otherwise directed by COUNTY or unless earlier terminated.

2. The AGREEMENT is amended to replace Paragraph A of EXHIBIT B, PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS as follows:

This Amendment to the contract shall increase the contract amount by \$1,074,479 (\$529,300 for year four and \$545,179 for year five) and shall extend the contract for an additional two (2) years for a total of a five (5) year Agreement in a not-to-exceed amount of \$2,862,357.

- 3. The **AGREEMENT** is amended to replace **ATTACHMENT B1**, **SCHEDULE OF FEES** in its entirety.
- 4. Except as provided herein, the parties have executed this **AMENDMENT** to be effective on the date executed by **COUNTY**.

#### **EXHIBIT B**

## AMENDED PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS Periodic Compensation (with attached Schedule of Fees)

- A. This Amendment to the contract shall increase the contract amount by \$1,074,479 (\$529,300 for year four and \$545,179 for year five) and shall extend the contract for an additional two (2) years for a total of a five (5) year Agreement in a not-to-exceed amount of \$2,862,357.
- B. Payment for services and/or reimbursement of costs shall be made upon CONTRACTOR's satisfactory performance, based upon the scope and methodology contained in EXHIBIT A as determined by COUNTY. Payment for services and/or reimbursement of costs shall be based upon the costs as defined in ATTACHMENT B1 (Schedule of Fees). Invoices submitted for payment that are based upon ATTACHMENT B1 must contain sufficient detail to enable an audit of the charges and provide supporting documentation if so specified in EXHIBIT A.
- C. Monthly, CONTRACTOR shall submit to the COUNTY DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE an invoice for the service performed over the period specified. These invoices or certified claims must cite the assigned Board Contract Number. COUNTY DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE shall evaluate the quality of the service performed and, if found to be satisfactory and within the cost basis of ATTACHMENT B1, shall initiate payment processing. COUNTY shall pay invoices for satisfactory work within thirty (30) days of receipt of correct and complete invoices or claims from CONTRACTOR.
- D. COUNTY's failure to discover or object to any unsatisfactory work or billings prior to payment will not constitute a waiver of COUNTY's right to require CONTRACTOR to correct such work or billings or seek any other legal remedy.
