Increase Appropriations to fund the Thomas Fire/Debris Flow Disaster Mutual Aid Response

Budget Action: Increase appropriations of \$257,129 in the Sherriff's Office General Fund for Services and Supplies - Professional Services funded by release of Committed Disaster Recovery fund balance.

Justification:

This budget revision appropriates an additional \$257,129 from Committed Disaster Recovery to the Sheriff's Office (\$257,129) for the Mutual Aid claims for the Thomas Fire and 1/9. In response to the disasters, more than 40 law enforcement agencies from throughout the State provided mutual aid services to the County. The value of the services exceed \$4.1 million which were incorporated into the County's larger reimbursement claim to FEMA and Cal OES. The prior release of \$3.8 million from Committed Strategic Reserve did not cover the County's 6.25% local share that must be paid to the Mutual Aid providers in order for FEMA to reimburse the 93.75% Federal/State share.
