This Policy was presented to and approved by the Executive Information Technology Council (EITC), which in turn recommends approval by the Board of Supervisors. The Policy standardizes procedures across all County departments for connecting to County technology assets when traveling internationally.

Background:

As more and more County users utilize the opportunity of remote computing, along with an increase in travel outside the United States, it is incumbent on the County to only allow international computing in those countries that exhibit a cyber-safe environment. This is especially true for users in roles with an elevated need to access County technology resources during travel. The Policy sets forth the conditions that will make international computing safe to County assets and data and restrict activity and computing tools that are deemed unsafe and put the County at risk.
