These criteria were established by the GFOA and adopted by the Board as budget development policy #7 (e.g. see <u>Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget Development Report and Proposed Policies</u>)

Priority I Imperative (Must-do)	Cannot reasonably be postponed in order to avoid harm or undesirable consequence. Correct condition dangerous to PH or safety Satisfy legal obligation Alleviates emergency service disruption Prevent irreparable damage to public facility
Priority II Essential (Should-do)	 Address clearly demonstrated needs or objectives Rehab/replace obsolete public facility Stimulate economic growth/private investment Reduce future operating & maintenance costs Leverage State/federal funding
Priority III Important (Could-do)	Benefit the community but may be delayed without detrimental effects to basic services New or expanded level of service Promote intergovernmental cooperation Reduce energy consumption Enhance cultural/natural resources
Priority IV Desirable (Other Year)	Desirable projects that are not included in 5-year program because of funding limitations
