Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors reprioritize funds within the UCSB Long Range Development Project to provide for funding of the El Colegio Roadway Project as previously directed by the Board of Supervisors on November 17, 2006.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda to establish El Colegio Road as a priority project for the County's UCSB LRDP Fund. Fund priorities were previously established by the Board of Supervisors in 2004. The El Colegio Road project, located in the community of Isla Vista, was reviewed more recently by the Board on November 17, 2006, when the El Colegio Road Agreement between the County of Santa Barbara and the University of California at Santa Barbara (UCSB) Agreement was approved.

Background:

On November 17, 2007, the Santa Barbra County Board of Supervisors authorized an agreement between the County of Santa Barbra and the University of California at Santa Barbara (UCSB) for design and construction of El Colegio Road in the community of Isla Vista. The agreement commits the County to provide design/permitting staffing services, as well as \$1.8 million toward construction of the overall project. Funding responsibility overall is as follows:

In January of 1991, the Board of Supervisors signed the Mitigation Implementation Agreement for the 1990 UCSB Long Range Development Plan (LRDP). This Agreement set forth funding for transportation projects to mitigate the impacts created by the 1990 LRDP. All transportation projects originally identified in the Agreement were constructed; however funds remained available as the County utilized other funding sources to build the projects. As a result, on February 17, 2004, the Board of Supervisors amended the list of priority projects.

Money has been held in the LRDP Fund for the priority projects identified by the 2004 Board authorization. Those projects include: El Colegio Roadway (\$1 million), Isla Vista Circulation Improvements (\$800,000), as well as other projects listed below. It is now necessary to reestablish projects priorities to reflect the County's commitment to fund the El Colegio Roadway Project. The chart below reflects the 2004 priorities, and the proposed priorities.

The traffic light at Camino del Sur will be completed with GTIP funding. Alternative transportation improvement projects are ongoing, and will continue to be funded with Measure D, Redevelopment Agency, and grant funds. The Isla Vista Parking Program was extensively studied and rejected by the California Coastal Commission. This parking program is not continuing at this time.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

El Colegio Road project, which is a primary circulation and roadway improvement, will be funded with this action. Future infrastructure projects in the Isla Vista area will be funded via forthcoming LRDP update, Redevelopment Agency monies, developer fees, and state and federal grant funding requests.
