AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS,
COUNTY OF SANTA BARBARA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
AMENDING CHAPTER 23 OF THE SANTA BARBARA COUNTY CODE

REMOVING PICACHO LANE (FROM EAST VALLEY ROAD (STATE ROUTE 192) TO MOUNTAIN DRIVE) FROM A 30 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

REMOVING LAS CANOAS ROAD (FROM MISSION CANYON ROAD TO THE SANTA BARBARA CITY LIMITS) FROM A 30 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

REMOVING CIENEGUITAS ROAD (BETWEEN FOOTHILL ROAD (STATE ROUTE 192) AND ITS NORTHERLY TERMINUS) FROM A 35 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

REMOVING SAN MARCOS ROAD (FROM CALLE REAL TO CATHEDRAL OAKS ROAD) FROM A 30 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

PLACING SAN MARCOS ROAD (FROM CALLE REAL TO CATHEDRAL OAKS ROAD) WITHIN A 35 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

PLACING SAN MARCOS ROAD (FROM CATHEDRAL OAKS ROAD TO TWO THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED FIFTY FEET NORTH OF CATHEDRAL OAKS ROAD) WITHIN A 35 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

PLACING VIA LOS SANTOS (FROM SAN MARCOS ROAD TO SAN ANTONIO CREEK ROAD) WITHIN A 35 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

PLACING STILLWELL ROAD (FROM CLARK AVENUE TO BLACK OAK DRIVE) WITHIN A 35 MILE PER HOUR SPEED LIMIT DESIGNATION

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: Ordinance Amendment

The following sections of Chapter 23 of the Santa Barbara County Code are amended to read as provided herein:

Section 23-15.4. - Thirty miles per hour speed limit. The speed limit for the highways or portions thereof designated in this section is hereby determined and declared to be thirty miles per hour.

BROADWAY, from Rice Ranch Road to Clark Avenue.

CAMINO CORTO, from El Colegio to Abrego Road.

CLARK AVENUE, from a point three hundred fifty feet west of Broadway to Norris Street.

COUNTRY ROAD, from Refugio Road to Calzada Avenue.

HOPE AVENUE, from Sterrett Avenue to State Street (Those portions within the unincorporated territory of the county).

HUMMEL DRIVE, from Mooncrest Lane to Patterson Road.
LAS PALMAS DRIVE, from Via Bendita to Las Olas Drive.
LILLIE AVENUE, from Valencia Road to Greenwell Avenue.
NOGAL DRIVE, from Vieja Drive to Hollister Avenue.
OLIVE MILL ROAD, from Hill Road to Coast Village Road (Those portions within the unincorporated territory of the county).
ONSTOTT ROAD, from Harris Grade Road to a point two hundred fifteen feet west of Pellham Drive (west).
ORCUTT ROAD, from Waller Lane to Goodwin Road.
RINCON HILL ROAD, from the Ventura County Line to State Route 150.
ROBLE DRIVE, from Las Olas Drive to Marina Drive.
ROMERO CANYON ROAD, from State Route 192 to Lilac Drive.
SAMANTHA DRIVE, from Refugio Road to Calzada Avenue.
SAN YSIDRO ROAD, from State Route 192 to Bolero Drive.
VEREDA DEL PADRE, between Farren Road and Vereda Leyenda.
VEREDA LEYENDA, from Calle Real to its northerly terminus.
VIA REAL, from Greenwell Avenue to a point three hundred feet east of Greenwell Avenue.

Section 23-15.5. - Thirty-five miles per hour speed limit. The speed limit for the highways or portions thereof designated in this section is hereby determined and declared to be thirty-five miles per hour.

ALSTON ROAD, from the Santa Barbara City Limits to Hot Springs Road.
APOLLO WAY, from Burton Mesa Boulevard to State Route 1 northbound off-ramp.
BARKER PASS ROAD, between Sycamore Canyon Road and the city limits of the City of Santa Barbara.
BRADLEY ROAD, from Patterson Road to Via Mavis.
BRADLEY ROAD, from Rice Ranch Road to Sage Crest Drive.
BROADWAY, from Rice Ranch Road to California Boulevard.
BURTON MESA BOULEVARD, between eight hundred feet east of Arneb Avenue and Apollo Way.
CALIFORNIA BLVD, from Broadway to the Santa Maria city limits.
CALZADA AVENUE, from Pine Street to Cimarron Drive.
CAMINO VIEJO, between Sycamore Canyon Road and the easterly city limits of the City of Santa Barbara.
CLARK AVENUE, from El Portal Street to Leon Street.
COLD SPRINGS ROAD, from Sycamore Canyon Road (State Route 192) to La Paz Road.
CONSTELLATION ROAD, from Jupiter Avenue to its northerly terminus.
EDISON STREET, from Tivola Street to two hundred feet north of Lindero Street.
EL COLEGIO, from Storke Road to the west boundary of the University of California at Santa Barbara.
GRAND AVENUE, from Park Street to Hollister Street.
HOT SPRINGS ROAD, from the Santa Barbara City Limits to Olive Mill Road.
HOT SPRINGS ROAD, from Riven Rock Road to Mountain Drive.
KELLOGG AVENUE, from the Goleta City Limits to Cathedral Oaks Road.
LA CUMBRE ROAD, between the northerly city limits of the City of Santa Barbara, approximately one hundred forty feet north of the centerline of Stacy Lane and Foothill Road.
LAS PALMAS DRIVE, from Paloma Drive to Via Bendita.
MIDDLE ROAD, from the Santa Barbara City Limits to Hot Springs Road.
MISSION CANYON ROAD, from the Santa Barbara City Limits to State Route 192.
MODOC ROAD, from Hollister Avenue to Encore Drive (east).
ORTEGA RIDGE ROAD, from Ortega Hill Road to State Route 192.

PATTERSON AVENUE, between Cathedral Oaks Road and Cambridge Drive.

PATTERSON ROAD, from Orcutt Road to Bradley Road.

REFUGIO ROAD, from Redondo Court to Deer Trail Lane (south).

SAN MARCOS ROAD, from Calle Real to Cathedral Oaks Road.

SAN MARCOS ROAD, from Cathedral Oaks Road to two thousand nine hundred fifty feet north of Cathedral Oaks Road.

SAN YSIDRO ROAD, from East Valley Road, (State Route 192) to North Jameson Lane.

SAN YSIDRO ROAD, from Bolero Drive to Mountain Drive.

SHEPARD MESA ROAD, from State Route 192 to Shepard Mesa Lane.

STILLWELL ROAD, from Clark Avenue to Black Oak Drive.

SYCAMORE CANYON ROAD, between Hot Springs Road and East Valley Road.

VEREDA DEL CIERVO, between Vereda Leyenda and the northern terminus of Vereda Del Ciervo.

VERONICA SPRINGS ROAD, (those portions only within the unincorporated area of the County), between Modoc Road and Las Positas Road.

VIA LOS SANTOS, from San Marcos Road to San Antonio Creek Road.

SECTION 2: Parts Not Affected

Those sections of Chapter 23 not set forth in this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: Publication and Effective Date

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days from the date of its passage; and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it, or a summary of it, shall be published once, with the names of the members of the Board of Supervisors voting for and against the same in a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of Santa Barbara as set forth in Government Code Section 25124.
