Approve, ratify and authorize the Chair to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) for the Agricultural Commissioner's Office to be reimbursed for regulatory activities for the Light Brown Apple Moth Program in the County of Santa Barbara for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019 in the amount of \$113,689.36

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors to approve, ratify, and authorize an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) to receive reimbursement for the cost of all activities to perform regulatory work in the Light Brown Apple Moth program. This program is primarily focused on quarantine implementation in accordance with the Federal Domestic Quarantine Order and California State Interior Quarantine, California Code of Regulations 3434 and emergency response activities as a result of detections of light brown apple moth in regulated establishments.

Background:

This program has been funded since 2008 and funding is anticipated to continue. The ongoing funding is made available through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and is distributed through the CDFA to the County Agricultural Commissioner's Office. In February of 2008, Light Brown Apple Moth was detected for the first time in Santa Barbara County. The USDA and the CDFA implemented quarantines in March of 2008, requiring additional regulatory activities to be performed by the

Agricultural Commissioner’s Office. As a result of these activities, Light Brown Apple Moth was eradicated from the County. The insect was again found in the Westmont College area in 2009 and was eradicated. In 2012, Light Brown Apple Moth was detected in Goleta, Carpinteria, and Santa Maria. Currently, there are infested quarantine areas in Goleta, Carpinteria and Lompoc. State and Federal Quarantines are in place and restrict the movement of locally grown nursery stock and produce. The efforts necessary to eradicate the pest and remove the restrictions from commercial agricultural operations are funded by this cooperative agreement.
