Project Background

Funding Source

- AB 941 (Bennett, Chapter 203)
 - California Department of Community Services and Development (CSD) is the state agency administering the grant.

Purpose

 The grant made funding available to counties interested in developing resource centers and programs designed to address the needs of farmworkers and their families.

Funding Amount

- \$833,000 grant funds from State.
- \$208,250 in required matching funds provided by the County of Santa Barbara.

Oversight

Department of Social Services and the Workforce Development Board.







PREFERRED LANGUAGE




FAMILY SIZE






AGE GROUPS

Comprehensive support for various documents/forms, complete assistance with public assistance programs, and in-depth cooperation with agencies,	Limited availability during the week, with some weekends upon request. Decreased aid in handling documents/forms, ongoing yet restricted support for public assistance programs, and a reduced partner engagement efforts with CBO's.
