- **Rental Assistance Program (United Way)**
 - 600 Households
 - \$1,000/month up to 3 months
 - On-line application will be available at: <https://www.unitedwaysb.org/rental-assistance>
- **Disaster Assistance Grant Program (United Way)**
 - 200 Households
 - \$1,250 each individual/family
 - Individual/household must attest they will self-isolate for 14 days.
