Recommended Actions:

Set a hearing for the September 1, 2009, departmental agenda to:

- a) Receive an overview of offshore oil and gas development from the Energy Division;
- b) Authorize the Chair to execute a comment letter on the draft Five-Year Outer Continental Shelf Leasing Program proposed by the U.S. Department of the Interior; and
- c) Authorize the Chair to execute a comment letter on rulemaking proposed by the Minerals Management Service that seeks to require all offshore operators to implement a Safety and Environmental Management System.

Summary Text:

Comments for item b, above, are due by September 21, 2009. Comments for item c are due by September 15, 2009. Staff will docket a full docket packet for the request September 1, 2009 hearing.

Background:

Earlier this year, Supervisor Carbajal requested the Energy Division to provide the Board with an overview of oil and gas development offshore Santa Barbara County. This overview prefaces staff recommended comments on the next five-year leasing program and recently proposed regulations.

The five-year leasing program defines the size, location and timing of leasing tracts in the nation's outer continental shelf for both oil/gas and renewable energy development. The draft program proposed by the

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U.S. Department of the Interior last fall includes four areas offshore California for consideration of new oil/gas leases: (1) the Point Arena Basin offshore Fort Bragg, (2) the Santa Maria Basin offshore Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo Counties, (3) the Santa Barbara Channel offshore Santa Barbara and Ventura Counties, and (4) the Oceanside/Capistrano Basins offshore San Diego County.

The proposed regulations by the Minerals Management Service seek to require all offshore platform operators to establish a Safety and Environmental Management System that would consist of four elements: (1) Hazards Analysis, (2) Management of Change, (3) Operating Procedures, and (4) Mechanical Integrity. The recommended regulations are based on investigations of previous accidents that equipment failure is rarely the primary cause, largely due to technological improvements. Rather, the investigation concludes that, in most cases, accidents and oil spills can be traced to human error and/or organizational failures.
