SUBJECT: Resolution Authorizing Signatories to Obtain Financial Assistance Regarding
Emergency Planning

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors adopt a Resolution authorizing certain employees to execute applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance under the Federal Defense Act of 1950, which covers local civil defense (emergency planning) expenses.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 2. A Safe and Healthy Community in Which to Live, Work, and Visit.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

Current state guidelines require a resolution of signature attestation, which designates authorized officials for executing applications and documents for obtaining financial assistance under the Federal Civil Defense Act of 1950 (the "Act"). The Act is administered through the state Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) Program, which provides up to one half of the personnel expense for authorized emergency planning staff, some services and supplies, and indirect costs. This resolution updates Resolution 01-381.

Subject: Authorizing Signatories to Obtain Financial Assistance Regarding Emergency Planning

Mandates and Service Levels:

Federal guidelines in 44 CFR Part 302, Civil Defense; State and Local Emergency Management Performance Grant Programs, prescribe the requirements applicable to the EMPG Program for federal financial contributions to the states, and through the states to their political subdivisions (“operational areas”), as subgrantees. The County is designated as the Santa Barbara Operational Area for emergency planning and response. While the County is not required to adopt an annual signature attestation resolution, it is advisable whenever there are personnel changes.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

This resolution allows County Fire/OES to apply for the file reimbursement claims under the EMPG sub grant program through the State Office of Emergency Services. The EMPG Program provides partial funding (up to one half the salary and benefits, depending on funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency) for the following positions in OES: Emergency Services Supervisor and four Emergency Services Planners. The amount received through this grant varies on an annual basis. For Federal fiscal year 2003 (October 1 through September 30) it is \$57,746.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND HEREBY RESOLVED that the individuals whose names, titles, and specimen signatures appear below are hereby designated as Authorized Officials and are authorized to execute for and on behalf of Santa Barbara County, a public entity established under the laws of the State of California, applications and documents for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance under the Federal Civil Defense Act of 1950, as amended.
