A 40 year resident and home owner in New Cuyama, I have a vested interest in the decisions that effect the valley and the town. A secure and sustainable water source is paramount to the future of New Cuyama; decisions made by the Cuyama Community Services District will have a direct bearing to secure and maintain this critical resource. I feel that I can bring value to the dialog and to the decisions that the Services District will be required to make and wish to be a part of the decision process.

For over 30 years I have worked in various capacities throughout the Cuyama Valley (Lockwood Valley to Rock Front Ranch). During this time I have gained experience in new construction and remodeling with specialized experience in plumbing repair and installation which included connecting to water walls for domestic and irrigation use. Working in the oil fields in the Cuyama Valley I became familiar with well drilling in general, phases of the drilling process, development, and operation. While there are certainly differences when compared to water well drilling, I have insights into the drilling process, risks, siting, and infrastructure.

Working with local ranches, I have assisted with pipefitting for pumps and flow meters and have conducted irrigation operations requiring the start-up and shutdown of pumping systems.

During their time in operation, I conducted all maintenance for the 17 rental homes held by New Cuyama Enterprises; the work I performed during the 15 years that I was employed gave me direct experience repairing connections to the town's water distribution and sewer systems.



Another area that I developed skills and experience is off-grid solar, initially working with remote property owners who did not have access to grid power. More recently this has expanded to property owners who are making a choice to support GREEN energy and/or avoid steadily increasing energy costs. My work in this area includes sizing the solar array and selecting panels, selecting mounting equipment (sun tracking and static mounts), battery bank sizing and selection, inverter sizing and selection, and installation and wiring of all elements to deliver desired power for the property owner. Most recently this has included conversion of a non-domestic water well from strictly grid power to owner selectable grid or solar power.

I believe that my experience above offers unique insight and understanding into the equipment, systems, challenges, and risks that the Cuyama Community Services District will be required to address in the near and extended future. As a homeowner and long term resident of New Cuyama I have a vested interest in the District's decisions, enjoying or suffering the benefit or consequences of those decisions. I look forward to the opportunity to serve the community that has been my home, sharing and representing our interests as my own.
