Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Adopt the attached Resolution (Attachment A) to establish “no stopping, standing or parking” zones on Isla Vista Alleys in the Isla Vista area in the Third Supervisorial District; and
- b) Find that the proposed actions are for the operation and maintenance of an existing public facility, involving negligible, or no expansion of use beyond that, which presently exists, that the proposed action is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act pursuant to 14 CCR 15301, and approve and direct staff to file the attached Notice of Exemption on that basis.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to establish “no stopping, standing or parking” zones on the Isla Vista Alleys in the Isla Vista area.

Proposed “No Stopping, Standing or Parking” Zones

Isla Vista Alleys

The Isla Vista Alleys are located in the Isla Vista area between Camino Corto to the west, Camino Del Sur to the east, Del Playa Drive to the south, and Pasado Road to the north. The Isla Vista Alleys were recently improved and repaved with a Public Works project. It was the desire of the community to have the Alleys open to vehicle, bike and pedestrian traffic after the Public Works project was completed. The proposed no parking zones in the Isla Vista Alleys are required to achieve this goal. The Sheriff’s Department supports the proposed no parking zones in the Alleys and will be the primary agency to enforce the parking restriction. Public Works recommends that your Board adopt the proposed no parking zone for the Alleys in Isla Vista.

Background:

Parking restrictions are established or rescinded based on safety, necessity, and community benefit. Public Works weighs all of these factors and presents any recommended changes to the Board of Supervisors for approval. These parking restrictions may include, but are not limited to “no parking”, “time limited” parking, “loading” zones, “vehicle height restricted” parking, “angle” parking, “handicapped” parking, or any combination of restrictions.

Public Works has surveyed the proposed no parking locations described in this Board Letter, and the parking restrictions would be in the best interest of the community and the traveling public. The proposed parking restriction would involve negligible, or no expansion of use of existing facilities. Public Works recommends your Board’s approval of the attached Resolution to implement these parking restrictions, and find the approval of these restrictions exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to 14 CCR 15301.
