Project Title: S.B. Clinic Multizone Air Handler # 6 and Roofing Replacement Project


Project Description: This project will replace the failed multizone air handler unit # 6 and replace the damaged roofing around the new unit. In addition the building controls system will be modified to allow the new air handler serving the building to be connected to the County Wide TREND 963 monitoring system.

Subsection (a) allows interior or exterior alterations involving such things as interior partitions, plumbing, and electrical conveyances, and subsection (d) allows restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety.
