PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The contract award is for a previously approved project. This project will rehabilitate and resurface sections of Central Avenue, Betteravia Road, Clark Avenue, and Santa Maria Way. Approximately 2.2 lane miles of County maintained roads will be resurfaced with the construction of this project


Reasons to support exemption findings (attach additional material, if necessary):
