WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors formed the County Arts Commission in 1977 to support and encourage participation in, and access to the arts for all county residents; and

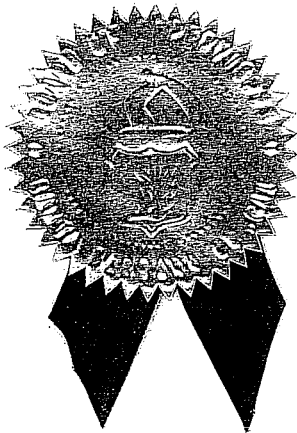
