Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors:

Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to submit, sign, and accept the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) in the amount of \$30,848 for the period July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008 from the California Corrections Standards Authority (CSA).

<u>Summary Text:</u> At their April 6, 2007 meeting, the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) met and agreed that the FY 2007-2008 grant should be used to fund services to minors participating in the three Juvenile Drug Courts, alcohol and drug orientations and group counseling in the Santa Maria Juvenile Hall, and to provide Teen Court services countywide.

Background: The Probation Department has been receiving Juvenile Accountability and Incentive Block Grant (JAIBG) funds from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) since FY 1999-00. Due to the creation of the Department of Homeland Security and the restructuring of the Federal Government that resulted, the OCJP ceased to exist as of September 30, 2003. In December 2003, the Probation Department was notified that the new administrator of the grant would be the Board of Corrections (BOC) which was renamed the Corrections Standards Authority starting in FY 2005-06. The Federal Government renamed the grant program the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) during the FY 2004-05 application period. Hereafter the program will be referred to as JABG regardless of the fiscal year. The eligible program areas remained the same.

In the past, JABG has been used to fund activities designed to improve and expand the Probation Community Service Work Programs, help development of the Juvenile Client Management system, to provide services to minors participating in the Juvenile Drug Court program, and to fund Teen Court services for minors in the three geographic regions of the County.

Since program inception, the Board of Supervisors has annually approved the resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to apply for and disburse the JABG grant funds from CSA.

Performance Measure: The Performance Measures for the Juvenile Drug Court Program are:

- RPM #117: Ensure at least 50% of youth in the Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) graduate successfully. In 2006 45% of 102 youths exiting the Juvenile Drug Court, graduated successfully.
- In FY 05-06, 81% of Juvenile Drug Court graduates did not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation.

The Performance Measure for the Teen Court Program is:

• Ensure that at least 80% of Teen Court graduates do not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation. In 2006, 84% of Teen Court graduates did not have a new felony or misdemeanor within six months of graduation.

The JABG grant funds ongoing Probation Department programs. Funds are used to purchase contracted services or activities. The grant, required match and program expenditures are included in Probation's FY07-08 proposed budget. FY07-08 grant funded expenditures including the required 10% match of \$3,428 total \$34,276. This is a \$2,784 reduction from the FY06-07 total of \$37,060. \$14,336 will fund core components of the Juvenile Drug Court program. \$12,540 will fund Teen Court activities. \$7,400 will fund alcohol and drug counseling in the Santa Maria Juvenile Hall. There is no increase in General Fund contribution due to this grant.

There will be no anticipated facility impacts. The project will use existing facilities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
