COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S RECOMMENDATION: POLICY

Schwartz/Marshall

1. a) I. Water and Wastewater: Conceptually approved the Water and Wastewater section of the plan as recommended by the Planning Commission, subject to the modification recommended by staff to WW-TC-2.5 as set forth in the P&D memorandum dated August 16, 2001. In addition, directed staff to develop an overarching policy in the land use/general section of the plan allowing policy exceptions to avoid takings.

Schwartz/Rose

1. a) II. Circulation:

Conceptually approved the Circulation section of the plan as recommended by the Planning Commission.

Schwartz/Marshall

1. a) III Geology, Hillsides, and Topography:

Conceptually approved the Geology, Hillsides, and Topography section of the plan as recommended by the Planning Commission, subject to modification of Development Standard GEO-TC 1.1, which should be replaced with language similar to the following taken from the Orcutt and Goleta Community Plans: "Development shall be prohibited on slopes greater than 30% unless this would prevent reasonable use of a property. In areas of unstable soils, highly erosive soils or on slopes between 20% and 30% development shall not be allowed, unless an evaluation by a qualified professional (e.g., soils engineer, geologist, etc.) establishes that the proposed project will not result in unstable slopes or severe erosion or this would prevent reasonable use of a property" and "Landscape plans shall be required for all development on slopes of 20% or greater, to ensure revegetation of graded areas. All landscape plans shall be subject to review by Planning and Development; landscape securities shall be required unless expressly waived by Planning and Development." Directed staff to identify options to allow flexibility to site development that minimizes grading, and decreases visibility and horizontal massing across slopes.

Schwartz/Rose

1. a) IV Public Service:

Conceptually approved the Public Service section of the plan as recommended by the Planning Commission with an addition to PS-TC-3 as follows: "Upon the request of the School District, the County shall consider participation in a joint task force comprised of representatives of the County and District for the purpose of identifying suitable future school sites within the District."

Schwartz/Urbanske

1. a) V Flooding and Drainage:

Conceptually approved the Flooding and Drainage section of the plan as recommended by the Planning Commission. Directed staff to return with amended language for FLD-TC-1.5 regarding annual maintenance.
