Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors considers the following recommendations regarding grant funding for the HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for the provision of HIV/AIDS services in the community:

- a) Approve and authorize the Public Health Department Director to execute Amendment 01 to Agreement Number 13-20252 with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Office of AIDS. This amendment increases the amount of this Agreement from \$49,575 to \$239,385 and extends the term by 2 years, for a new contract period of: July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2015.
- b) Determine that these activities are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act and are exempt from environmental review per CEQA Guideline Section 15378(b)(4), since they are a government fiscal activity that does not involve any commitment to a specific project that may result in a potentially significant effect on the environment.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda to amend the existing HIV/AIDS Prevention Program Grant Agreement. The HIV/AIDS Prevention Program funds the identification of individuals unaware of their HIV-positive status and to provide information on HIV care and treatment as an effective prevention strategy.

Prevention Program activities include:

Targeted HIV testing to prioritized high-risk populations

HIV/AIDS Prevention Program Revenue Agreement Number 13-20252

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- Partner notification services
- Hepatitis C Rapid Testing to prioritized high-risk individuals.

Background:

The CDPH Office of Aids previously funded HIV/AIDS services via the Master Grant Agreement (MGA). The MGA included funding for three (3) Office of AIDS programs: the HIV Care Program; the HIV Prevention and Expanded Testing Program; and the HIV/AIDS Surveillance Program. The MGA expired on June 30, 2013 and its three programs are now being funded through three separate contracts.

The CDPH elected to align the HIV/AIDS Prevention Program funding cycle with the calendar year. As a result of this realignment, the Prevention Program agreement was initially funded with a six-month cycle: July 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013. On August 20, 2013, your board approved the original agreement for \$49,575. This Amendment extends the term for two full years following the new grant cycle (January – December).
