That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Accept extension to Contract No. 14-06-200-600, between the County of Santa Barbara and the United States Department of the Interior Bureau of Reclamation to continue to administer the Lake Cachuma Recreation Area for the period of January 12, 2009 to January 12, 2011.
- 2. Authorize the Chair to sign and return the attached letter dated December 16, 2008 Bureau of Reclamation, indicating acceptance, and simultaneously transmit the attached letter from the County, accepting the terms and conditions, to the Bureau of Reclamation.
- 3. Approve the Notice of Exemption pursuant to the County's California Environmental Quality (CEQA) guidelines (post).

Summary Text:

On November 26, the Board of Supervisors authorized the extension of a lease between the County of Santa Barbara and the US Bureau of Reclamation for two years from January 12, 2003 to January 12, 2005.

The extension was to provide the Bureau of Reclamation additional time to complete the preparation of a Resource Management Plan (RMP) necessary to begin negotiations. In December 2004, and again in December of 2006, the County and Bureau of Reclamation entered into a second and a third two-year

extensions to January 2009. As of this date, although the RMP has gone through a lengthy public review process, it has not been finalized. Therefore, negotiations for a long-term lease cannot begin.

At this time, an additional short-term, two-year extension is required so that sufficient time is provided to complete the RMP and conduct long-term lease negotiations.

Background:

The County of Santa Barbara, through its Parks Department, has operated and managed the Lake Cachuma Recreation area for over 50 years under lease agreement with the Bureau of Reclamation. Upon any renewal of a contract lease, the Bureau is required to complete a Resource Management Plan (RMP) for the federally owned land. The RMP process started in 2000 with public scoping meetings, and since then has been under development with participation from County Parks and the Cachuma Operations and Management Board (COMB).

The County currently provides an array of recreation amenities including but not limited to fishing, camping (tent, cabin, RV, and yurt), boating and nature cruises to approximately 800,000 visitors each year at Lake Cachuma. The County's original fifty-year lease with the Bureau of Reclamation to manage Lake Cachuma Recreation Area expired in January of 2003, with interim extensions through January 12, 2009 now in effect.

The short term extensions ensure that recreation services currently provided at Lake Cachuma Continue uninterrupted and that all long-term critical issues associated with the lease renewal are sufficiently analyzed and addressed. The extension also allows the existing concessionaires to continue operation under the same interim period. The offer from the Bureau also includes and additional 6 month extension, if required to competitively seek concessionaires for the recreation area, upon transitioning into a new long-term agreement. It is therefore recommended that the board of Supervisors accept an amendment to contract No. 14-06-200-600 extending this lease to January 12, 2011 in which all existing terms and conditions remain in effect.

A letter from the Board of Supervisors to the Bureau of Reclamation is attached and acknowledges the County's acceptance of the lease extension.

The project is exempt from CEQA under Section 15301 - Class 1 Categorical Exemption, which consists of "the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination."

Dear Mr. Hernandez:

Santa Barbara County (County) has expressed an interest in obtaining a second interim extension of the existing Land Management Agreement (LMA). In order to accommodate the completion of the Resource Management Plan and the subsequent negotiation of a new LMA for the Federal lands around Lake Cachuma, the Bureau of Reclamation has determined that it is in the best interest of the United States to continue to extend the interim Period of Performance of the existing agreement (Contract No. 14-06-200-600) for an additional two more years.

Therefore, pursuant to Section 3 of the subject contract, Reclamation is extending the termination date of the subject interim extension from January 12, 2009 to January 12, 2011. However, if as anticipated a new long-term management agreement is completed prior to that date, Contract No. 14-06-200-600 will terminate on the date of execution of the new agreement.

The County may extend existing Concessions Agreements on a year-to-year basis not to exceed two years ending January 12, 2011. It is expected that the new long-term LMA will allow an additional extension of up to six months from its date of execution, if necessary, in order to allow for a competitive selection of Concessionaires and an-orderly transition to new Concessions Agreements.

All other terms and conditions of Contract No. 14-06-200-600 shall remain in full force and effect during this interim period.

Reclamation recognizes the importance of the recreational resources at Lake Cachuma to the recreating public and the economy of the County. While Reclamation recognizes that our views differ on the cost allocation for recreational facility improvements, Reclamation will continue to work with the County to support their efforts to secure funding to improve and update all facilities at Lake Cachuma, including the drinking water and wastewater treatment plants.

Reclamation congratulates the County on the completion of over 50 years of successful operation at Lake Cachuma providing nationally recognized recreational opportunities for the people of the State of California and the entire Nation. Reclamation looks forward to working with the County to ensure the availability of these recreational opportunities well into the future.

Please let this letter serve as acceptance of the extension of the period for performance of Contract No. 14-06-200-600 for the existing Land Management Agreement for the Cachuma Lake Recreation Area. Your letter dated December 4, 2008, is incorporated by this reference and the offer contained therein is hereby accepted by the County. The attached minute order from the County Board of Supervisors' December 16, 2008 meeting indicates the action taken on this item and approval to enter into the lease extension.

Therefore, by mutual agreement of the parties pursuant to Section 3 of the subject contract, the Agreement to Administer Recreational Area dated January 12, 1953; (your contract number 14-06-200-600) is hereby extended until January 12, 2011. However, it is anticipated that a long-term management agreement with the County will be completed prior to that date. If such is the case, Contract No. 14-06-200-600 may terminate on the effective date of the new agreement. Furthermore, it is noted, that the County may extend existing concession sub-lease agreements at the Cachuma Lake Recreation Area on a month-to-month basis, not to exceed the two years ending on January 12, 2011.
