WHEREAS, Mr. Villegas taught a variety of courses at SBCC for ten years and in 1993 was elected to the SBCC District Board of Trustees, a position he still holds; and

WHEREAS, as a Trustee, Mr. Villegas has helped shape the policies and strategic direction of SBCC to best serve the thousands of students – including underrepresented populations – who come to pursue their dreams of higher education; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Villegas has provided leadership for the community colleges at a statewide level through executive positions with the California Community College Trustees and the California Association of Latino Community College Trustees; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Villegas has made serving the needs of youth and the Hispanic community high priorities in his life. He was a co-founder of the Hispanic Business Council of the Santa Barbara Chamber of Commerce and co-founder of the Santa Barbara YMCA Chicano/Latino Youth Leadership Conference.
