SUBJECT: Storm Damage Repair at Alisos Ave. Bridge No. 51C-190; Project No. 98R047

Recommendation(s):

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Accept Notice of Completion for work performed by the Contractor, Granite Construction Company, (not a local vendor), P.O. Box 50085, Watsonville, California 95077-5085, and authorize Clerk to record.
- B. Review and approve the Statement of Final Quantities for work performed and materials supplied for this project by the Contractor, Granite Construction Company, (not a local vendor), P.O. Box 50085, Watsonville, California 95077-5085, in the amount of \$230,244.30.

Alignment with Board Strategic Plan:

The recommendation is primarily aligned with Goal No. 1, An Efficient Government Able to Anticipate and Respond Effectively to the Needs of the Community.

Executive Summary and Discussion:

The project stabilized the creek bottom beneath the Alisos Avenue Bridge by constructing a grade stabilizing cutoff wall at the upstream portion of the repairs to maintain a constant streambed elevation beneath the bridge. Large, four ton rock was placed along the creek bottom, upstream and downstream from the cutoff wall, to prevent erosion of the creek bed and banks for a distance of approximately 50 meters on both sides of the bridge. Willow cuttings were planted on the unprotected portions of stream bank.

The contract was accepted on April 11, 2003, and was completed on time and within the allotted contract amount.

The project was bid in accordance with the Public Contract Code, which requires the Department to award to the lowest responsible bidder and was recommended for funding in the FY 2001/2002 Capital Improvement Plan.



Mandates and Service Levels:

No change in programs or service level.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The project was funded by the State Department of Housing and Community Development's Block Grant Program and the State Office of Emergency Services and was budgeted in Department 054, Fund 0015, Org Unit 0001, Program 2900, Account 7510.
