

(d) Restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety, unless it is determined that the damage was substantial and resulted from an environmental hazard such as earthquake, landslide, or flood.


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LOCATION Third Supervisorial District


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LOCATION Fourth Supervisorial District


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LOCATION Fifth Supervisorial District


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
