

Youthful Offender Block Grant Funding Application Juvenile Justice Development Plans

Due Date: January 1, 2008

On or before January 1, 2008, each County is required by Welfare & Institutions Code (WIC) 1961 to prepare and submit to the Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) for approval, a Juvenile Justice Development Plan (JJDP) for youthful offenders who have not committed an offense described in WIC Section 707(b) and who are in custody of the county commencing September 1, 2007. Submission of this completed application, once approved by CSA, satisfies the legal requirement for counties accessing Youthful Offender Block Grant (YOBG) funds and serves as a county's Juvenile Justice Development Plan.

Before filling in the required information, save both parts of the application as new documents. For ease of filling, please include the name of your county in the file name, for example JJDPSacramento.doc and JJDPSacramento.xls. Once completed, attach both files to an e-mail and send to jjdp@cdcr.ca.gov by January 1, 2008. Board Resolutions (such as the example in Section 5) may be submitted up to April 1, 2008. After CSA reviews the application, we will notify all parties identified in Section 1 of the Plan's approval and/or if additional information is required.

Section 2 - BLOCK GRANT FUNDED PROGRAMS / SERVICES

The Juvenile Justice Crime Prevention Act (JJCPA) mandates that each county implement a Comprehensive Multiagency Juvenile Justice Plan to receive JJCPA block grant funding. The Youthful Offender Block Grant program builds on the JJCPA capacities by providing additional funding to support effective offender program activities.

The YOBG legislation requires counties to use funds to enhance the capacity of county probation, mental health, drug and alcohol, and other county departments to provide appropriate rehabilitative and supervision services to youthful offenders subject to WIC Sections 731.1, 733, 1766, and 1767.35 These rehabilitative and supervision services (listed below), though not limiting the uses for the funding, provide a basis for the legislature's finding that local justice offender programs are better suited to provide rehabilitative services for certain youthful offenders than state-operated facilities. Section 2 identifies the coordination of YOBG funds with JJCPA funds.
