Future Action to Address Potential Shortfall

- One or more actions in mid-2028
 - Identify County-owned site(s) for emergency shelters
 - Extend existing contracts for emergency shelters
 - Amend LUDC and/or CZO to allow emergency shelters ministerially



PROPOSED AMENDMENTS



Objective Standards

- 1. Sufficient parking
- 2. Size/location of waiting/client intake areas
- 3. Onsite management
- 4. Proximity to other emergency shelters



Definitions

- Emergency Shelter: "... may include other interim interventions, including but not limited to, navigation centers, bridge housing, and respite or recuperative care."
- Low Barrier Navigation Center: "... non-congregate and relocatable."



Environmental Review

- CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15265
 - No significant environmental impacts



Recommendations

- 1. Make the required findings for approval (Attachment A)
- Determine the project is exempt from CEQA (Attachment B)
- 3. Approve the Emergency Shelter Zoning Ordinance Amendments by adopting the ordinances (Attachments C and D)
- 4. Adopt a resolution (Attachment H) authorizing P&D to submit the coastal amendments to the California Coastal Commission
- Direct P&D to transmit the adopted resolution to the Coastal Commission
