Summary Text:

August has been celebrated as Child Support Awareness Month since President Clinton's 1995 federal proclamation. Every year at this time, we highlight the importance of child support services and how they assist families and children. The State Department of Child Support Services has chosen "They don't need perfect. They just need you" as this year's theme. Locally, Santa Barbara County Department of Child Support Services professionals will observe the month by focusing on public outreach to parents, children and community members to raise awareness of the services offered by our program.

Background:

Many parents can be overwhelmed by the complexities of raising a child, striving hard to be the "perfect" parent. To that end, this year's Child Support Awareness Month campaign encourages parents with this year's theme: "They Don't Need Perfect, They Just Need You." This message references all of the benefits that children receive from the participation of both parents in their lives, and helps all parents remember that the Child Support Services program is there to assist them in reducing the stress of the child support process.

Almost 13,000 families are served through Santa Barbara County's Child Support program. Last year, the program distributed \$24 million to families in Santa Barbara County, an increase over the previous year. There have been progressive programs implemented in the child support system that include
