SUBJECT:	Consider Response to the Grand Jury Report on "Effects of Immigration in Santa Barbara County"	

Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors:

a. Set a hearing (estimated 15 minutes) for August 21, 2007 to consider the responses to the Civil Grand Jury report entitled "Effects of Immigration in Santa Barbara County: A Balanced Assessment."

On August 21, 2007:

- a. Adopt the responses in Attachment (1) as the Board of Supervisors' responses to the 2006-07 Grand Jury Report entitled "Effects of Immigration in Santa Barbara County: A Balanced Assessment", and
- b. Authorize the Chair to sign the letter included in Attachment (1) forwarding the responses to the Presiding Judge.

Summary Text:

On June 4, 2007, the Civil Grand Jury released a report entitled "Effects of Immigration in Santa Barbara County: A Balanced Assessment". The purpose of this report, as noted on page 1 of the Summary, was to investigate the effects of immigration within the County to ascertain both the benefits and liabilities created by immigrants. The report includes four findings and four recommendations.

It is recommended that the Board adopt the responses to the Grand Jury Report contained in the attached letter to the Presiding Judge.

Response to Civil Grand Jury report "Effects of Immigration" August 14, 2007 Page 2 of 2

Background:

This item is on the Board's agenda due to a statutory requirement. Per California Penal Code Section 933 (b), the governing body of the agency, the Board of Supervisors, must respond within 90 days after the issuance of the Grand Jury Report. Therefore, the Board of Supervisors' response must be finalized and transmitted to the Courts and the Grand Jury no later than September 2, 2007.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

No impacts associated with responding to this report. However, if the Board should consult with experts and develop techniques to obtain better data (recommendation 2), there may be associated fiscal costs.

Fiscal Analysis:

Narrative: There is no fiscal cost associated with departments utilizing existing government databases (Recommendation 3a). However, actively monitoring the status of immigrants beyond what is legally required by the federal or state government, developing additional techniques to obtain better data (recommendation 2) or measuring and reporting on the effects of immigration (recommendation 1) may necessitate additional resources.

Special Instructions:

The response of the Board of Supervisors must be transmitted to the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court no later than September 2, 2007. The Clerk of the Board is requested to return the signed letter to Brenda Castillo, County Executive Office, for distribution to the Superior Court. The signed letter, written responses and a 3 ¹/₂" computer disc with the response in a Microsoft Word file must be forwarded to the Grand Jury.
