SUBJECT: 2005 Storm Damage Asphalt Concrete Overlay Project on Bella Vista Drive, Refugio Road, San Marcos Road and Via Giatero Road. First, Second and Third Supervisorial Districts; County Project Number 810527

Recommended Action(s):

- A. Approve the Project and Categorical Exemption pursuant to the County's California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines for the 2005 Storm Damage Concrete Overlay Project on Bella Vista Drive, Refugio Road, San Marcos Road and Via Giatero Road.
- B. Authorize the Director of Public Works to advertise for construction bids for the 2005 Storm Damage Asphalt Concrete Overlay; County Project Number 810527

Summary:

A section of Bella Vista Drive was damaged by slides on to the roadway as well as by the heavy equipment used to clear the roadway. This area will require reconstruction of failed areas on the roadway, reconstruction of asphalt concrete dikes and the installation of several overside drains. A short section of Refugio Road was damaged and it will require an overlay as well as shoulder repair work. Approximately 3.6 miles of San Marcos Road was damaged by the clean up operations. This section of San Marcos Road from Cathedral Oaks Road to Highway 154 will require an overlay. A section on Via Giatero Road from the Highway 154 overcrossing to the end and the first 250 feet of the south of the overcrossing will require an overlay along with replacement of portions of the existing asphalt concrete curb.

Pursuant to the County's CEQA guidelines, staff has determined that the project is exempt from further environmental review. Approval of the Categorical Exemption shall indicate the Board of Supervisors' approval of this project and will commence the appeal period, pursuant to State CEQA guidelines.

The "Notice to Contractors" will be published prior to the date set for the opening of bids.

Sealed proposals will be received at the Public Works front counter in the County Engineering Building, 123 E. Anapamu Street, Santa Barbara, California 93101, and at the North County Public Works office, located at 620 West Foster Road, Santa Maria, California 93454, and will be opened publicly and read aloud at a date to be determined.



Background:

As your Board knows, the winter storms of 2005 caused a tremendous amount of damage to the County road system. Bella Vista Drive, Refugio Road, San Marcos Road and Via Gaiatero Road were all heavily damaged.

There were five recorded storm damage sites on Bella Vista Drive. The operations to clean up the sites caused severe damage to the roadway.

On Refugio Road there were seven recorded storm damage sites and the operations required for debris cleanup caused moderate damage on segments of the roadway. As a result of the heavy loads and tracks on the dozers and excavators, the roadway was damaged and will require resurfacing.

On San Marcos Road there were 10 damage sites for a total cost of over \$8,000,000 to repair. There was one large landslide that took over three months to remove. The operations to remove the slide caused severe damage on segments of the roadway. The roadway was designed to accommodate standard vehicles loads and not the heavy trucks and equipment weights required to remove the debris. As a result of the heavy loads and tracks on the Dozers and Excavators, the roadway has failed in many areas and will require resurfacing. San Marcos will require resurfacing from Cathedral Oaks Road to Highway 154.

Via Gaitero Road was used as a stockpile site of material from road storm damage sites. Material at the site was separated into vegetation, soil and rock. The roadway was damaged by the equipment that was used to dump stockpile and separate the material. Via Gaitero Road from the Highway 154 bridge to the northern end and the first 250 feet south of the bridge will require resurfacing.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) will fund 75% and State Office of Emergency Services (OES) will fund 25% for the project sites on Bella Vista Drive, Refugio Road and Via Gaitero Road. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) will fund 88.53% and OES will fund 11.47% for the San Marcos Road site.
