FCC Declaratory Ruling November 18, 2009



Federal Telecommunications Act of 1996

- Preserves local zoning authority over "placement, construction and modification" of wireless facilities
- Some limitations:
 - "Shall not unreasonably discriminate"
 - "Shall not prohibit or have the effect of prohibiting"
 - "Shall act...within a reasonable period of time"

FCC Declaratory Ruling November 18, 2009



Three part ruling:

- 1) Defines presumptive "reasonable time" as:
 - 90 days to process collocation applications
 - 150 days to process all other applications
- State or local government cannot deny an application solely because service is available from another provider

FCC Declaratory Ruling November 18, 2009



- 3) FCC to preempt ordinances that impose a blanket variance requirements on facility siting
 - DENIED
- → FCC affirmed that local governments do not have the flexibility to deny or delay action on applications based on perceived health effects of RF emissions

Recent Moratoria in California

- City of Pasadena (Last amended 1997)
- City of Glendale (Last amended 1996)
- City of Agora Hills (Last amended 1995)

Use of Moratoria

- "Shall not prohibit or have the effect of prohibiting"
- Local government shall act on any request "within a reasonable period of time"
 - Presumptive "reasonable time" defined as
 - 90 collocation
 - 150 new facility

Use of Moratoria

- "Necessary and bona fide effort to act carefully in a field with rapidly evolving technology."
- Time since the Telecommunications Act of 1996 was enacted and the moratoria is adopted
- Whether a comprehensive regulatory scheme governing wireless communications facilities is already in place



- Created in 1995 (before Telecom. Act)
- Last revised in 2005
- Provides regulatory scheme for different types of facility designs and locations



- Considers use of new technology such as RF transparent camouflage designs and "very small facilities...mounted on either an existing operational public utility pole or similar support structure"
- Tiered approach implemented to streamline processing
- Design requirements based on type and location of facility

Tier 1 Project (Small antenna installed on an existing utility pole)	All zones	Coastal Development Permit or Land Use Permit	Staff
Tier 1 Project (Antennas entirely concealed within an existing structure)	Nonresidential zones	Coastal Development Permit or Land Use Permit	Staff
Tier 2 Project (Tenant improvements and architectural projections)	Nonresidential zones	Development Plan approved by the Director	Director
Tier 2 Project (Additions to existing structures or New structure within height limit)	Nonresidential zones, except not allowed in the Recreation (REC) zone	Development Plan approved by the Director	Director
Tier 3 Project (New structure exceeding height limit but not to exceed 50 ft.)	Nonresidential zones, except not allowed in the Recreation (REC) zone	Minor Conditional Use Permit	Zoning Administrator
Tier 4 Project (All others)	All zones	Conditional Use Permit	Planning Commission
