FINDINGS TO SUPPORT DETERMINATION: (attach additional material, if necessary):

The installation of a back up battery system at the County's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) is a minor alteration to the existing facility. The EOC is an existing structure with minor exterior alterations to install and connect a battery system just outside the building. The project is statutorily exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant Sections 15301 (minor alterations to existing facilities) and 15303 (limited construction of small facilities) and 15304 (minor alterations to land) of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations

15301 Class 1 consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use. The types of "existing facilities" itemized below are not intended to be all-inclusive of the types of projects, which might fall within Class 1

- (a) Interior or exterior alterations involving such things as interior partitions, plumbing, and electrical conveyances;
- (b) Existing facilities of both investor and publicly-owned utilities used to provide electric hthenergy/batterry sgip/noe battery storage system at eoc.docx v. Oct 2014

power, natural gas, sewerage, or other public utility services;

15303 Class 3 consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made in the exterior of the structure. The numbers of structures described in this section are the maximum allowable on any legal parcel:

- (d) Water main, sewage, electrical, gas, and other utility extensions, including street improvements, of reasonable length to serve such construction.
- (e) Accessory (appurtenant) structures including garages, carports, patios, swimming pools, and fences.

15304 Class 4 consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry and agricultural purposes. Examples include but are not limited to: (f) Minor trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored
