Uniform Rules - Overview

2

- Implement the Williamson Act
 - ▣ Property tax reduction for owners of land in agricultural production
 - ▣ 10- to 20-year Contracts
- Sets eligibility requirements for Agricultural Preserves
- Provides rules for other uses (ag related and non-ag related) on Agricultural Preserves



Direction on the Uniform Rules

3

- Cannabis cultivation and ancillary facilities are agriculture
- Retail sales and marketing are prohibited
- Processing, distribution, and manufacturing of cannabis from offsite sources shall be allowed as long as 10% is from on premises



Right to Farm - Overview

4

- Agriculture is protected from being a public nuisance
 - ▣ No agricultural activity conducted for commercial purposes shall be or become a nuisance, due to any changed condition in or about the locality, after it has been in operation for more than three years



Direction on the Right to Farm Ordinance

- Cannabis cultivation is not afforded the protections of the Right to Farm ordinance
 - ▣ Federal status as a controlled substance
 - ▣ Involves potential adverse effects that differ from the cultivation of other crops
 - ▣ Requires unique development standards
 - ▣ Taxed different than other agricultural products



Recommendation

6

- Make the required findings, including CEQA
- Adopt the resolution amending the Uniform Rules
- Consider the introduction of amendments to the Right to Farm Ordinance
- Read title and waive reading of the Ordinance in full
- Determine for the purpose of CEQA
 - ▣ That the approval of the amendments are within the scope of the Cannabis Land Use Ordinance and Licensing Program, and the PEIR
 - ▣ That no subsequent EIR or Negative Declaration is required
