- □ 1,723 additional faculty/staff


Housing:

- □ 1,874 faculty/staff units


Academic Space:

Impacts of LRDP Growth

Potential impacts to four primary County service areas:

- Roads/transportation infrastructure
- Fire Protection
- Law Enforcement
- Isla Vista

- LRDP DEIR released.
- County provides comments.
- First negotiations between County and UCSB.
- UCSB releases re-circulated DEIR.
- County comments on the re-circulated DEIR.
- Second round of negotiations between County,
 City of Goleta and UCSB.
- County Board of Supervisors meeting.
- UC Regents to approve LRDP, certify the LRDP
 EIR and approve the four draft agreements.

Proposed Agreements

Four separate agreements proposed:

- LRDP Mitigation Implementation and Settlement (Traffic and Housing)
- 2. Cooperative Agreement for Fire Protection, Emergency Response and Paramedic Services
- 3. Cooperative Agreement for Law Enforcement
- 4. Cooperative Agreement for Isla Vista Community Improvements

LRDP Mitigation Implementation and Settlement (Traffic and Housing)

Enrollment/Housing.

- Caps UCSB student enrollment at 25,000 students.
- UCSB housing for all new students (5,000 new beds)
 phased in step with enrollment growth.
- 1,874 new faculty/staff units in phase with the LRDP growth.

LRDP Mitigation Implementation and Settlement (Traffic and Housing)

UCSB Traffic Mitigation.

- \$3.1 million for County traffic improvements (Los Carneros/Mesa Road intersection, Los Carneros and Storke Road widening)
- Substantial additional mitigation for City of Goleta traffic improvements.

LRDP Mitigation Implementation and Settlement (Traffic and Housing)

Traffic Monitoring Program.

- UCSB will monitor actual traffic generation annually.
- If UCSB traffic exceeds 2,170 PHT and UCSB is unsuccessful in reducing trips by other means, then UCSB will pay supplemental trip fee (STF) for excess trips.
- □ STF amount = the average of the City and County's GTIP fee (currently \$14,215/trip).

Fire Protection/Emergency Services

County to provide:

Full 2-in/2-out fire fighting capability.

 Emergency medical response services at UCSB (currently provided by UC Police).

 Continuation of UCSB's current student emergency medical technician (EMT) intern program.

Fire Protection/Emergency Services

UCSB to provide:

- Funding for a percentage of 2.04 additional firefighter posts now (equivalent of \$979,112 based on current post costs).
- \$83,500 annually for EMT intern program.
- □ Funding for 100% of the cost of additional firefighter posts needed for LRDP student enrollment growth (1:4000 firefighter to student ratio) (\$858,750 annually based on current post costs) in pace with UCSB growth.

Fire Protection/Emergency Services

UCSB also to provide:

- In lieu property tax fees for any faculty/staff units which are leased, not sold.
- Funding for a new ambulance (\$170,000).
- A replacement for Fire Station 17 in the event UCSB demolishes the station.
- A lease to County for a one-acre parcel on West Campus for a future fire station.

Law Enforcement

- Ongoing commitment by UCSB to maintain current
 IVFP staffing (7 UC Police officers).
- Additional 2.25 FTE of UCSB officers to be temporarily assigned to the IVFP during nights and weekends, in step with enrollment growth.
- A separate, operational MOU for specific staffing and scheduling issues at the IVFP.

Isla Vista Community Improvements

- UCSB to provide County \$3.6 million for IV improvements that facilitate circulation between Isla Vista and the UCSB campuses.
- UCSB commitment to continue support of other, existing IV programs.
- UCSB to participate in the development and implementation of a parking program for Isla Vista.

CEQA Exemption

- CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(a) exempts activities which are not a "project."
- Section 15378(b)(4) exempts the creation of government funding mechanisms, where no commitment to any specific project that would have environmental impacts.
- The mitigation and cooperative service agreements are government funding mechanisms which are exempt under CEQA.

Summary

- Four separate agreements.
- Agreements would substantially address all major impacts of 2010 LRDP growth.
- Agreements are a not a project under CEQA.
- Approval of agreements avoids litigation over adequacy of 2010 LRDP EIR.

Recommendation

- Approve and, contingent on the UC Regents' first signing the four agreements, authorize the Chair to sign all four agreements.
- 2. Accept the CEQA Exemption pursuant to Section 15378(a) and (b)(4) of the CEQA Guidelines.
- 3. Approve and authorize the Chair to sign a letter to the University of California Regents indicating the County's conditional support of the Long Range Development Plan, subject to execution of the four agreements.
