Regardless of whether Cannabis is a good industry for Santa Barbara County long term. The science of terpenes and its ability to impact flavor profile of grapes is not settled science. No one can definitively speak to whether there is a consequence or not. Anyone who definitively asserts it a problem or not-a-problem is speaking from a position of advocacy for a special interest.

The legalization of non-THC hemp in combined with new legal permissions for research of federally funded Universities (e.g. UC Davis) to study these terpenes means better data can inform decision making. This requires patience at the policy making level.

Given the lack of definitive data, the precautionary principle should guide your decision making on this topic. Given time, research will answer this question. In so many other contexts, Santa Barbara County has utilized the precautionary principle to protect our community.

I urge the Board of Supervisors to not make decisions that can't be undone when further information in the future will provide much greater illumination. This entire conversation had been framed in the language of Yes/No. I believe the appropriate framing is Now/Later. Choosing later is a choice for better science and better public policy.
