Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors adopt a Resolution designating certain County executive positions, as listed in the resolution, to execute an application and grant documents on behalf of the Santa Barbara Operational Area for the purpose of obtaining financial assistance through the Fiscal Year 2007 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP), which includes the State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) and Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP).

<u>Summary Text:</u> The Federal Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is providing financial assistance directly to the states to enhance the capability of local units of government to prevent, deter, respond to, and recover from incidents of terrorism involving the use of chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive weapons. This funding is, in turn, provided to the Santa Barbara Operational Area by the State of California via the Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) for Fiscal Year 2007.

#### **Background:**

The Santa Barbara Operational Area consists of the County and all governmental subdivisions within the County including the eight incorporated Cities and numerous Special Districts. In an effort to streamline funding to the states, the Federal Department of Homeland Security has consolidated the administration of two grant programs within one application package:

1. The <u>State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP)</u> is a continuing program that provides funding to the Santa Barbara Operational Area for planning, equipment, training, and management/administrative purposes. The FY 2007 SHSGP is a continuation of annual funding that began with the FY 1999 State Domestic Preparedness Equipment Program.

2. The **Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP)** is a continuing program that would provide funding to the Santa Barbara Operational Area for various law enforcement activities, including: information sharing, target hardening, threat recognition, and interoperable communications.

#### **Performance Measure:**

The County is designated, as the Santa Barbara Operational Area, for emergency planning and response. The State office of Homeland Security has required Operational Areas throughout the State to act as lead agencies and as coordinators /facilitators of the Homeland Security Grant Program. While the County is not mandated to obtain all available grant funding, it is advisable to take advantage of the funding provided through this grant program. The SHSGP and LETPP are fully funded grant programs with no matching funds required. In addition, 3% of the total funding may be used to cover management and administrative costs associated with facilitation of the grant.
