**Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture to receive reimbursement for the County's High Risk Pest Exclusion Program for the period of July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 in the amount of \$78,743.00; and
- b) Determine that the above action involves government funding mechanisms and/or fiscal activities and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4).

**Summary Text:**

This item is on the agenda for the Board of Supervisors to review and execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) to receive reimbursement for the County's high Risk Pest Exclusion Program. CDFA has defined high-risk shipments as those where there exists a high degree of likelihood that one or more "A" or "Q" rated plants pest will be introduced or spread via the shipment. "A" and "Q" rated pests (Medfly, Oriental Fruit Fly, Red Imported Fire Ant, Asian Citrus Psyllid, etc) are those that have been determined to have potential for causing severe damage to the State's agricultural industry, natural resources, or environment. Through this agreement, CDFA reimburses the Agricultural Commissioner's Office for costs associated with staff conducting inspections of high-risk shipments. These inspections are conducted at pre-defined high-risk pathways

such as Fed Ex, UPS, Post Office, and truck shipments to commercial nurseries in order to insure compliance with federal, state, and local regulations.

**Background:**

The Agricultural Commissioner’s Office has received funding for this program activities since FY 1999-2000. The funding for the High Risk Pest Exclusion Program is anticipated to continue in order to provide reimbursement for our high risk inspection activities.
