**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Request for the Chair of the Board to approve, authorize and execute the Agreement between the City of Santa Maria and the County of Santa Barbara to haul cover material to the Santa Maria Regional Landfill over the County Maintained Road System. The Public Works Department has reached an agreement with the City of Santa Maria (CITY) for the continuance to haul landfill cover material over the County Maintained Road System. This agreement covers hauling activity since the original 2006 Memorandum of Understanding (2006 MOU) terminated in December 2012, as well as future landfill cover material hauling until its completion. To date, the CITY has delivered approximately 2.5 million tons of cover material to the Landfill and expects to haul an additional 1 to 2 million tons prior to capping the landfill.
