- Provides wastewater services to Orcutt and unincorporated Santa Maria area
- Conserves resources
- Protects the environment

Past Regulatory Issues and Effects on Development

- PROBLEM: High salt loading from water purveyor and water softeners
- 1987 order to comply with RWQCB Waste Discharge Permit limits for salt content
- 1997 Approval of Orcutt Community Plan
- 2004 completed plant upgrade to tertiary treatment and reduce salt

Prop 218 notice: 9,200 parcels and 880 mobile homes

Long Range Fiscal Plan - Purpose



- Incorporate Enterprise Fund reserve policy adopted June 2007
- Anticipate rate of growth and new connections
- Worked with CEO and A/C offices on the plan
- Board authorized master plan underway to update and reassess future needs. Board presentation at a later date
- Determine impacts to developer fees and sewer service rates

Long Range Fiscal Plan - Details

Sewer service rates proposed to increase 7%

6% anticipated in future years

 Rate of development can also affect rate schedule



Proposed Sewer Service Charge for 2009-2010

 Residential example as collected on tax roll

Proposed annual rate	\$519.47
Last year's rate	\$486.38
Rate increase/yr	\$ 33.09

Equivalent to \$2.76/month

Breakdown of Increase

- The 7% increase is comprised of:
 - ▶2.5% Reserve policy requirement
 - ▶1.9% Additional membrane purchases
 - ▶1.9% Salary changes
 - ▶0.6% Energy cost changes
 - ▶ 0.1% Chemical cost changes

Trunk Line and Connection Fees:



- Paid by development for system impacts.
 - Trunk line fees fund sewer system capacity improvements
 - Connection fees fund future treatment and disposal capacity improvements
- Currently updating capital improvement needs.
