Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize Amendment No. 1 to Agreement BC22054 with Geosyntec Consultants, Inc. (a local vendor) for construction management services pertaining to the optimization of the leachate collection and recovery systems for the Tajiguas Landfill, and increase the Agreement amount by \$62,990 for a revised total amount not to exceed \$432,360;
- b) Determine that the recommended action to award a contract construction management, is a fiscal and administrative activity not constituting a "Project" within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), as set forth in 14CCR 15378(b)(4) and (5).

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to amend County Board Contract BC22054 with Geosyntec Consultants, Inc. (a local vendor) to provide construction management for the reconfiguration and optimization of componentry and infrastructure of leachate collection and recovery systems (LCRS) at the Tajiguas Landfill. The scope of the original Agreement included regulatory compliance consulting services pertaining to groundwater protection at the County's solid waste management facilities, including the Tajiguas Landfill. Amendment No. 1 is necessary to perform construction management for

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the LCRS optimization project. The LCRS systems are designed to collect liquids from a groundwater interceptor trench and two sets of horizontal dewatering wells.

Background:

The Tajiguas Landfill opened in 1967 and is owned and operated by the Public Works Department Resource Recovery and Waste Management Division (RRWMD). The RRWMD is responsible for the management and operation of existing activities at the Tajiguas Landfill and subject to compliance with state and federal regulations to ensure its safe operation. Approval of the Amendment No. 1 to Agreement BC22054 with Geosyntec Consultants, Inc. will assist RRWMD in continued compliance with these regulatory requirements (Attachment A). The LCRS optimization project was determined to be exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301(Existing Facilities), 15302 (Replacement or Reconstruction) and 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures). The notice of exemption for the project was posted at the Clerk of the Board on July 28, 2022. The contract for construction management for the activity is not a project under CEQA.
