#### **Board Direction on Recommended Actions**

- A. Consider public input on, and approve revisions to, the County's updated draft Citizen Participation Plan;
- B. Consider recommendations for funding contained in the:
  - 1) FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 draft Action Plan Substantial Amendments
  - 2) Draft FY 2014-15 Annual Action Plan for the use of federal funds under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) programs;
- C. Receive a staff report on the HOME Consortium and CDBG Urban County Partnership draft FY 2014-15 Annual Action Plan, FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 Action Plan Substantial Amendments (Amendments) and the annual Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) process, including recommendations for the award of HOME, CDBG and ESG funding;



### Recommended Actions Cont.

- D. Consider public comments received during the thirty (30) day public comment period, which began on March 14, 2014 and will conclude on April 14, 2014; the period of time from the expiration of the 30-day period until the Board's April 15 hearing; and during the Board's April 15, 2014 Public Hearing and provide direction to staff on any changes to the draft FY 2014-15 Annual Action Plan and the FY 2011-12, 2012-13, and 2013-14 draft Action Plan Substantial Amendments and recommendations for funding contained therein;
- E. Direct staff to finalize the draft FY 2014-15 Annual Action and the FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 draft Annual Action Plan Substantial Amendments and return to the Board on May 6, 2014 for consideration of approval for final submission of the FY 2014-15 Action Plan and the FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 draft Annual Action Plan Substantial Amendments to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) by the HUD deadline of May 16, 2014.



#### **Section I: Action Plan**

- Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) 2014 federal entitlement grants:
  - 1) HOME Investment Partnerships Act (HOME)
  - 2) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)
  - 3) Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG)
- HCD is the lead for the HOME Consortium and CDBG Urban County Partnership

















## **Public Participation Process**

- Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) published on November 19, 2013
  - NOFA emailed to over 200 interested organizations
  - NOFA placed on County HCD website
  - Two public workshops/meetings held (Santa Maria and Santa Barbara)
- HOME applications are accepted throughout the year



## 2014 Action Plan Rating and Ranking Criteria

- Key Criteria:
  - Commence and be completed in a timely manner
  - Project feasibility and eligibility
  - Organizational capacity to complete the project
- Review Committees Represent North and South County
  - Human Services Commission Subcommittee
  - Capital Loan Committee



### **HOME Investment and Partnerships Program**

#### The County's 2014 HOME allocation is \$937,493

- Ten-percent of the funds (\$93,749) will be used by the County for program administration as permitted by HUD
- ♦ \$843,744 is available for HOME-eligible Consortium projects of which 15% will go to Community Housing Development Organizations (CHDOs) per HUD regulations
  - FY 2014-15 reservation includes \$247,000 in funding for a Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program (Santa Maria)
- ❖ HOME applications are accepted throughout the year and will go before the Capital Loan Committee and the Board for review and approval



# **CDBG Urban County Partnership**

#### The 2014 CDBG Urban County Partnership Entitlement = \$1,511,673

**County's Capital Award** = \$619,129 for capital projects plus administration (6 applications for over \$1 million dollars)

- \$22,534 from Buellton and Solvang
- ❖ \$246,789 reprogrammed funding
- ❖ \$123,479 program income

Total County Capital Funds = \$1,011,931

**County Public Services Award** = \$142,875 (27 applications requesting \$542,295)

❖ 2013 unspent Public Services funds = \$8,145

Total County Public Services Funds = \$151,020

**County Administration = \$226,751** 









#### **Section II: Action Plan Amendments**

- Amendments include deletion of a project; addition of a project or substantial change in scope or budget
- 2011-2012, 2012-13 and 2013-14 Action Plan Amendments to reprogram unspent funds and allocate funding to the 2014 NOFA projects:
  - Reprogram \$16,533 remaining from a completed CDBG project (2011-12)
  - Reprogram \$100,000 in unspent CDBG funds from projects that did not move forward (2012-13)
  - Allocate \$50,000 in HOME funds to the City of Santa Maria for their Tenant Based Rental Assistance Program (TBRA) (2013-14)
  - Reprogram \$130,256 in unspent CDBG funds from projects that did not move forward (2013-14)



# Section III: Citizen Participation Plan

#### Revise 2007 Citizen Participation Plan

- The revised Citizen Participation Plan will not eliminate the Board approval process for funding recommendations
- To make technical corrections and bring the plan current
- Revise the definition of "Substantial Amendments"
- Allow flexibility in the public notification process
- Provide for flexibility by accepting HOME applications throughout the year



## Board Actions May 6, 2014 Meeting

- Approve Action Plan and Substantial Amendments
- Adopt a Resolution authorizing submittal of the final FY 2014-15 Annual Action Plan and Amendments to HUD;
- Authorize the County Executive Officer or designee to execute all certifications, standard forms and other related required documents; and
- Determine that the approval of the FY 2014-15 Action Plan and FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 Action Plan Amendments are not the approvals of a project subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(4), finding that the actions are not a project as they are the creation of government funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities, which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, and direct staff to file the Notice of Exemption.
