That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Adopt the attached resolution setting a public hearing on the departmental agenda for May 22, 2007 in connection with the street lighting districts listed below.
- B. Receive and file a fixed Charge Fee Report for fiscal year 2007/2008 with the Clerk of the Board on May 1, 2007, which reports the proposed benefit assessment (no increases) for the following lighting districts:
 - 1. County Service Area 3;
 - 2. County Service Area 31; and
 - 3. North County Lighting District.
- C. Approve Public Works Department Notice of Exemption pursuant to County California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines. (Post.);
- D. Adopt at the conclusion of the public hearing on May 22, 2007 the attached resolution establishing street lighting charges for the above subject lighting districts for the fiscal year 2007/2008.



Summary Text:

Street lighting services are provided through the county in unincorporated territory identified as county service areas or lighting districts. County service areas may also provide additional services. Unincorporated territory not located in a county service or lighting district does not receive street lighting services and are generally more rural in nature or may have developed prior to the provision of street lighting. Street lighting systems are installed by development as conditions of approval pursuant to Resolution 81-229 and County Engineering Design Standards. Territorial boundaries of county service areas or lighting districts are expanded via annexations through the Santa Barbara Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO). The poles and fixtures are generally owned and maintained by the electric company (PG& E in the north county and Edison in the south county). Revenue to fund electric and maintenance costs billed monthly by the electric companies is generated through property taxes and in some cases through benefit assessments. Benefit assessment charges are adopted annually for placement on the tax roll for those county service areas or lighting districts that receive these revenues.

Background:

County Service Area 3 (unincorporated Goleta and Santa Barbara), County Service Area 31 (Isla Vista), and the North County Lighting District (Casmalia, Los Alamos, unincorporated Lompoc, Orcutt, and unincorporated Santa Maria) are the county service areas or lighting districts that receive benefit assessments in addition to or in lieu of property tax allocations in order to fully fund street lighting costs. A benefit assessment is a levy or charge by an agency upon real property that is based upon the special benefit conferred upon the real property by a public improvement or service that is imposed to pay the capital cost of the public improvement, the maintenance and operation expenses of the public improvement, or the cost of the service being provided. This action addresses the adoption of benefit assessment charges for these county service areas or lighting districts.

County Service Area 3

County Service Area 3 (CSA 3) was formed July 23, 1962 by Resolution No. 22409. CSA 3 boundaries cover portions of the unincorporated, urbanized area of the Goleta Valley between the cities of Goleta and Santa Barbara. CSA 3 provides for 1,430 streetlights, open space maintenance, and maintenance of Goleta Beach County Park and Tucker's Grove County Park. Street lighting revenues are generated from property taxes and benefit assessments. CSA 3 will continue to have a benefit assessment rate of \$8.00 per residential parcel, \$4.00 for undeveloped parcels and multiples of \$8.00 for commercial or multiple residential units. Annual revenues for street lighting for FY 07/08 are estimated to be approximately \$95,855 from property taxes and \$66,345 from benefit assessments with total revenue of approximately \$162,200. Annual street lighting costs for FY 07/08 are estimated to be \$162,200. There is no proposed increase to the benefit assessment source of revenue with this action. Such an increase would require voter authorization pursuant to Proposition 218.

County Service Area 31

County Service Area 31 (CSA 31) was formed December 16, 1963 by Resolution No. 23685. CSA 31 boundaries include the unincorporated community of Isla Vista, located west of the University of California at Santa Barbara. CSA 31 provides for 277 streetlights, street sweeping, and minor capital improvements. Street lighting revenues are generated from property taxes and benefit assessments. CSA 31 will continue to have a benefit assessment rate of \$8.00 per residential parcel, \$4.00 for

undeveloped parcels and multiples of \$8.00 for commercial or multiple residential units. Annual revenues for street lighting for FY 07/08 are estimated to be approximately \$11,390 from property taxes and \$20,810 from benefit assessments with total revenue of approximately \$32,200. Annual street lighting costs for FY 07/08 are estimated to be \$32,200. There is no proposed increase to the benefit assessment source of revenue with this action. Such an increase would require voter authorization pursuant to Proposition 218.

North County Lighting District

The Santa Barbara North County Lighting District was formed on March 22, 1994 by Resolution 94-14. That action consolidated the Casmalia, Orcutt, and Los Alamos street lighting districts as well as the street lighting functions of County Service Area 4 (unincorporated areas in Lompoc) and County Service Area 5 (unincorporated areas in Santa Maria). The North County Lighting District currently provides for 2,727 streetlights. Revenues are generated from property taxes as well as benefit assessments generated from the CSA 5 portion of the North County Lighting District. The CSA 5 area of the North County Lighting District will continue to have zone benefit assessment rate of \$14.73 per residential parcel, \$7.36 for undeveloped parcels and multiples of \$14.73 for commercial or multiple residential units. Annual revenues for FY 07/08 are estimated to be approximately \$541,632 from property taxes and \$129,640 from benefit assessments with total revenue of approximately \$541,632. Annual street lighting costs for FY 07/08 are estimated to be \$397,400. There is no proposed increase to the benefit assessment source of revenue with this action. Such an increase would require voter authorization pursuant to Proposition 218.

New Tracts

When a proposed development is annexed to a county service area or lighting district, there may or may not be a distribution of revenue from property taxes depending on the tax rate area (TRA) assigned to it by the Auditor-Controller's Office. A TRA is a list of taxing authorities that receive a distribution from the basic 1% property tax. A TRA for a new development is based on neighboring TRAs with the same list of taxing authorities after annexation. The distribution may vary dramatically depending upon the number and type of taxing authorities included. In many cases the amount of revenue from the basic property tax are insufficient or non-existent for street lighting. In these situations, benefit assessments were established to cover these shortfalls.

However, since the passage of Proposition 218 in 1996, the ability to increase benefit assessments to cover increasing electrical costs has been hampered due to voter authorization. In order to not reduce existing revenue, County policy has been to require new development to ensure its lighting impacts are fully funded through tract specific or zone assessments. In summary, each new tract required to annex into a street lighting district forms a separate assessment zone within the county service area or lighting district with its own service rate. In this way, each new tract will provide adequate revenues to finance its own street lighting costs as a special benefit to the tract and not take away revenue from existing revenue sources. Unique to this procedure is the ability to adjust the street lighting rates in accordance with inflation, the consumer price index (CPI) and the actual cost of electricity (as authorized by the owner/developer). Annual adjustments may exceed the CPI but is limited to 10% of the prior fiscal years' budget. Prior to occupancy, the developer is conditioned to pay the cost of lighting from the date of occupancy (energizing) through the end of the fiscal year pursuant to paragraph 3 of Resolution 81-229. Thereafter, fixed charges based on the actual lighting costs up to the approved zone assessment amount per parcel will be billed on the tax roll. The rates will be adjusted in future years as previously described. The following tracts have formed zones of benefit and will have separate benefit assessments

Performance Measure:

No change in programs or service level if the benefit assessment rates are established for 2007/2008; for County Service Area 3, County Service Area 31, and North County Lighting District. A drastic reduction in revenue would result if the rates were not established.

Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

There is no recommended increase to the original benefit assessment rates or to the current zone benefit rates for County Service Are 3, County Service Area 31, and North County Lighting District. Property taxes and benefit assessments will meet the anticipated budget for fiscal year 2007/2008. The amounts benefit assessment rates described and the amount shown in the benefit zone table are proposed for placement on the tax roll in fiscal year 2007/2008.

WHEREAS, the California Government code provides that a County may collect charges within a County Service Area to pay in whole or in part for a particular authorized extended service furnished in the County Service Area; and

WHEREAS, the furnishing of highway lighting is an extended service authorized to be furnished within County Service Area No. 3, County Service Area 31 and the North County Lighting District, in accordance with, and to be collected with county ad valorem property taxes pursuant to the provision of § 28-81, subd. (e) of Chapter 28 of the Santa Barbara County Code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provision of Government Code Sections 25210.77 (a) and 54710, et seq., the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara has adopted in Chapter 28 of the Santa Barbara County Code provisions for making and collecting charges for the furnishing of said services; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has satisfied the requirements and provisions of the Government Code and County Code to establish and benefit assessment charges for various types of properties within County Service Area No. 3, County Service Area 31 and the North County Lighting District and has determined to establish charges accordingly for the Fiscal Year 2007/2008; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors finds that the benefit assessment charge set forth in this resolution are exempt from CEQA review pursuant to Public Resources Code 21080, subd. (b) (8) (1) and (2) (14 CCR 15273), in that benefit assessment charges will be used for operating expenses and for the purchase of supplies, equipment and materials; and

WHEREAS, § 28-81, subd. (d), of the County Code and § 54716, subd. (d), of the Government Code provide that at the hearing on the report to confirm the proposed benefit assessments, the Board of Supervisors shall hear and consider all objections or protests, if any, to the reports, and, at the conclusion

of the hearing may adopt, revise, change, reduce or modify any charge and shall make its determination by resolution upon each charge as described in the report or as determined at the hearing:
