Project Description: The Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-2017 Annual Action Plan represents the County's federal grant application to HUD for the 2016-2017 program year. As the lead agency for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Urban County Partnership, Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Santa Barbara County HOME Consortium, the County is responsible for preparing and submitting the Action Plan annually on behalf of these partnerships. The FY 2015-2020 Consolidated Plan addresses the affordable housing, community development needs and market conditions in order to assist the jurisdictions in making investment decisions. The Action Plan Amendments will reprogram uncommitted funds from FY 2012-2013 and 2014-2015 to capital development projects, micro-economic development projects and funds for use under the Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program.


