



# Countywide IT Strategic Plan

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## **Background**

- County's previous IT Strategic Plan (ITSP) was published in 2018
- Collaborative approach was taken with the new ITSP
- Ensure alignment with County's current RENEW initiatives
- This is not Central IT (ITD) strategic plan, it is a *Countywide* IT Strategic Plan







#### **Collaborative Approach**

- IT Strategic Plan committee formed in January 2024 with representatives from all functional groups
- This committee met bi-weekly from January through August 2024
- Multiple in-person and virtual meetings were held with at least one representative from every department
- Survey sent to Countywide IT staff, department heads, assistant department heads, and County executives with over 150 responses received
- A third-party Strategic Planning consulting firm (Insights & Strategies) facilitated the committee and departmental meetings








## Four Components of the ITSP
