Recommended Actions:

Authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors and the Chair of the Board of Directors to execute quitclaim deeds extinguishing the County's and the Flood Control District's easements on Assessor Parcel numbers 061-362-001, -005, -006, and -007 (herein the "Subject Properties"). Direct staff to record each quitclaim deed in the Office of the County Recorder.

Summary Text:

The Santa Barbara County Flood Control and Water Conservation District recently installed the Via Rueda Interceptor Storm drain (herein the "Storm Drain") which collects and carries storm water from Vieja Drive down to Atascadero Creek. The Strom Drain diverts water away from an existing concrete lined ditch located on the Subject Properties. Execution and recordation of the quitclaims will extinguish the County's and District's easement interest and obligation to maintain any portion of the above referenced ditch. All County and District ownership interest in the Subject Properties will be extinguished.

Background:

This project is located on Vieja Drive off of Puente Drive in the unincorporated area of Santa Barbara County.

Via Rueda is a roadway in the immediate vicinity of the project. The residential tract which includes Via Rueda was developed in the early 1960's. The Tract Map which created the subdivision includes a "Flood Control Easement to the County of Santa Barbara" for the purpose of maintaining a portion of the concrete ditch. That ditch is located behind the Via Rueda homes at the foot of a slope that extends up to the Vieja Drive right-of-way. The Vieja Drive right-of-way along this reach is a dirt road held by the County via easement which is not within the County's maintained right of way system.

Over the years, access to the concrete ditch to perform maintenance has been problematic for the Flood Control District since it is not accessible to equipment. Consequently, maintenance of the ditch has been labor intensive. The Flood Control District conceived of a project to install a storm water drain system within the Vieja Drive right-of-way, immediately above the Via Rueda housing tract (herein the "Project"). The Project will intercept storm water that historically drained to the above referenced concrete ditch, and will carry it down to Puente Drive. The Project includes approximately 1,100 feet of storm drain, inlet facilities and manholes within the Vieja Drive right-of-way and a newly acquired Flood Control easement on 4640 Vieja Drive. The Project is more accessible to equipment for maintenance purposes than the concrete lined ditch.

The existing Flood Control easement within the Via Rueda residential tract is being quitclaimed back to the underlying property owners and will remove the County's and the District's liability associated with the concrete ditch located within the above referenced easement. The owners of the Subject Properties have given written consent to this action.

On March 14, 2007 the Santa Barbara County Planning Commission ruled that the Project is in conformity with the adopted General Plan (65402 conformity) as part of the Capitol Improvement Plan.
