

During the 1960s the juvenile crime rate in England rose dramatically. At the recommendation of the Albermarle Report The National College for the Training of Youth Leaders was set up and local authorities injected money into building youth centers under the auspices of local education boards. These were open five nights a week and during the weekends many additional activities were organized.

I undertook volunteer work at an established large London settlement for young teenagers, and then attended the National College for the Training of Youth Leaders, in Leicester. Upon graduation I shortly became leader in charge of a youth center attached to a high school near Nottingham, and finally to the warden of a new large purpose-built youth and community center in Edmonton, London, responsible for the purchasing of equipment, furnishings, and hiring of about 40 staff, both paid and volunteer. The membership grew to over 1,000. Meanwhile my then husband (whom I met at college) worked in two other youth centers.

A few years later my husband became warden of the first British half-way house for young drug addicts, again responsible for buying furniture and equipment. We lived in the house. I was involved in as many meetings and the every day life of the addicts as was possible (I was still working in Edmonton). Initially, the young people came from a drug and alcohol unit of a nearby psychiatric hospital. We ran the house on a hierarchal system. The length of stay averaged 18 months and as a young person progressed, taking more self-responsibility, communicating clearly, acting appropriately, he/she then obtained a job locally.

Eventually I and our son joined family living in Hollywood, California. I worked at the Screen Actors Guild for about eighteen years. My focus was our family and work, and some volunteer work at the Suicide Prevention Center in Los Angeles. My son's behavior changed and it was recommended my current husband Bill and I join Tough Love: a self-help group for parents, with professional counselors for the teenage groups. For three years the three of us were involved with weekly Tough Love meetings, and shortly afterwards our son entered a drug addiction unit, the first time for three months, the second time for two months. The three of us entered into individual, group, and family counseling. We also attended Al Anon, AA, NA. and ASAP.

After our son left home, I continued at the Guild as a business representative for theatrical films, and went to school for my AA and two BAs. In 2004 my husband and I moved to Carpinteria. Since then I have worked at SBCC as a teacher's aide teaching English as a Second Language to adults in Carpinteria. I am peripherally involved with Carpinteria Beautiful, Friends of the Library etc. My professional and personal experience with the effects of drug and alcohol abuse on the individual, family and community makes me very aware of the need for education and consistent support for the families and individuals involved. I believe I could be useful to the Advisory Board.
