The Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors is the responsible agency for authorizing the Public Works Director Public Works Director to file a claim with the Santa Barbara County Association of Governments for an allocation of Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds for fiscal year 2017-2018. The term project refers to the activity which is being approved and which may be subject to several discretionary approvals by governmental agencies. The term project does not mean each separate governmental approval. Further, the authorization to proceed with the TDA will not create any unusual circumstances which would create a possibility that there would be a significant effect. Therefore, given the resolution to file the TDA claim is not a project it can be found to be exempt from CEQA.
